

#### A Message from Deacon Al Streckfus OSSD

I'd like to share with you two interesting stories that I recently read in the book entitled "The Parables of Joshua". The first story helps us to relate to the statement, God is three in one. The author talks about the sun and the lake. He explains to us, that when we look at the lake we see no ripples or waves but a water that is calm as a mirror, we say to ourselves how beautiful as it reflects the sun. It lights and heats the water and causes life to grow. God is like the sun, as his presence emanates from his being; it's not just like a reflection, but the image of God's mind. That reflecting image of God also embodies God's love and together with the Father reaches out to the goodness they see in each other. The family loved the young girl and taught her how to read, and helped her develop her mind. The girl's memory was extraordinary. The girl's memory helped her to understand

people and events, and her insight into people's lives. One day a rich man was alerted about this young girl, and wanted to meet her. The family allowed the girl to visit and after meeting the girl the man asked the family if she could stay with him and be his assistant for he had many responsibilities. They agreed to let the girl stay. The family who had given her up for adoption was envious and bitter. Joshua told this story to a young girl, who felt she had nothing to offer to the world, like her brothers did. Joshua explained to the girl that God gives each of his children valuable talents to share with everyone they meet. Joshua goes on to tell the girl to nurture these gifts that God gave her to share with others. Joshua ends his story by telling the young girl that her heavenly Father places each of us on earth for a purpose. Many of you know the history of Prince of Peace, there are many new members that do not. In August of 1929, ground was broken for the original church. In October of 1929, the cornerstone was laid, and so began the building of The Evangelical Lutheran Church of the Prince of Peace. Prince of Peace continued to thrive through the years.

In May of 1955, ground was broken for the Sunday school building and Prince of Peace continued to thrive. April 1969 ground was broken for the "new church". October 1969 the cornerstone was laid for what is the current sanctuary. June 21, 1970 was the dedication of the new sanctuary. Prince of Peace has a long successful history in the greater Rosedale area. As with any building large or small, there seems like there is always a new project going on. Some of them more expensive than others. It certainly can be a challenge to keep a facility this large in good working order especially with building codes changing throughout the years. From a new roof, to the up keep of the day care building, to upgrading of plumbing and electric to the restoration of our beautiful pipe organ, not to mention keeping everyone comfortable with upgraded heating and air conditioning. It is by the grace of God and the dedication of the members of this church with guidance from the volunteers on the property committee that we can continue to have the beautiful sanctuary, the use of Ellenberger Hall, the Sunday school rooms upstairs all the way to the basement used by day care and Artistic Synergy. It is our duty as a congregation to see to the up keep and maintenance of this property so that we may continue to share our many blessings we receive for many years to come.

Thank you for your generous gift of \$1,000 to support the work of Lutheran Campus Ministry throughout our Synod. What a joy it is to know that there are so many folks who believe in the value of what we do on campus and who are eager to support the work that God is doing in and through our students!

The beginning of this semester has been an exciting one. At Towson, we have to set out extra chairs at the table every week since we have more and more students coming. We can't wait to outgrow the room we're meeting in! We also have a group of 6 students who have joined a discipleship group. They are meeting weekly to spend more time in Scripture and support each other in the hard work of following Jesus.

At UMBC, we have spent the beginning of the semester talking about how to be faithful Christians in an uncertain political climate- when and how do we resist policies that hurt our brothers and sisters while respecting those who hold different views. And next week we begin to get ready for Lent, by beginning a 7week study of the 7 deadly sins, complete with weekly challenges to help us work against those realities in ourselves and in our world. And we're rejoicing as we are getting ready to serve our brothers and sisters in Lumberton, NC- with students from Morgan State (who has the same Spring Break as other schools for the first time in 5 years!), Towson and UMBC together. Several students who are just getting connected to our ministry are jumping right into the adventure of this trip which will involve flood relief work and learning from our Native American brothers and sisters. And speaking of service work, our Morgan State students are working with Deacon (soon to be Pastor) Reggie Price to find ways to serve our homeless brothers and sisters in Baltimore by sharing food on a monthly

This is work that you help to make possible. It is vital and joyful work in God's kingdom and I am grateful for It was a joy to be with your support in it.

Each Baltimore church is committing to the number of kits they will make and ship or deliver to LWR, and they hope to deliver 500 kits from our region in October 2017, as an intentional way of recognizing what our brothers and sisters in the Baltimore region are doing while celebrating a big anniversary for the church.

Social Ministry has been tasked with being the point committee of organizing Lutheran World Relief Kits of Care for Prince of Peace.
