A Message from Pastor Matt

Dear Friends,

I am very excited to share with you a wonderful and, I believe, Holy Spirit inspired opportunity that Prince of Peace has been afforded. In working with the Bishop's office to address staffing needs and concerns, we have the chance to call a second pastor to come and serve at our congregation. We have been given the name of an outstanding individual who will be graduating seminary this month, and (if called by the congregation) will be coming to us as his first call. This recommendation comes from Bishop Bill Gohl who has been supporting and encouraging Prince of Peace during this time of transition.

I have met and been in communication with the candidate, who I say with great excitement and sincerity is incredible, and we would be blessed to have him serve with us.

He is bright, articulate, and very faithful. He brings a deep spirituality that is beyond his years. I feel that we share the same work ethic, and I think we would be able to balance each other and provide great assistance in ministry.

He definitely has a pastor's heart, and I would want him to be my pastor if I was looking for a church (and for that matter will be pastor to my wife and children as we serve together).

I feel very strongly that he and I would work just as well as Deacon Shari Trotter and I did, and while not being a second Shari, brings a lot of the same gifts that she did, while adding many distinct ones of his own.

He is a "utility player" and will get along with both young and old. I see us working collaboratively, allowing current ministries to deepen and strengthen, while allowing new ministries to grow.

He has been serving as a concurrent intern (meaning going to seminary and serving in a parish at the same time), and has had a lot of direct pastoral experience even though not yet ordained.

I cannot begin to articulate how excited and overjoyed I am imagining what God will do here in the coming years.

Again, if called by the congregation, this would begin as a three-year term call. The difference between a term call and a regular call, is that a term call is a fixed agreement between the candidate and the congregation. As such, at the end of the three year time, both parties could choose to continue. However, if it is not a possibility for a variety of reasons – sense of call, financial, other unforeseen circumstance, etc., either party could conclude the ministry at that time. However, it is my hope and prayer that the potential for ministry and growth will be realized and we will have a long and successful ministry together for as long as God wills it.

In discussing the financial obligations involved, the Finance Committee met and feels confident that we can make this three year commitment.

As we continue to discern the road ahead, the process will look something like this.

The candidate will meet with the Church Council soon. Due to the nature of the term call, and it being a second pastoral situation, the Church Council has the authority to act as a traditional call committee.

If recommended by the Church Council, Prince of Peace will hold a combined, ONE service on Sunday, June 25 at 10 AM. There will be a special congregational meeting to vote immediately following the service. There will also be a

chance to meet and greet the candidate at a light breakfast beginning at 9 AM. Following the service, during which the candidate will preach, the congregation will vote on the candidate, and if affirmed, will be able to start serving with us this summer.

Over the past year, many of you have expressed concern for me and my well-being, knowing that the needs and demands of the congregation are not small. I give thanks for your support, and for all the hard work that others have done to step up and continue the ministry we share. However, help is needed. Not just for me, but for the mission and purpose that we share in the Gospel.

I am firmly convinced that this individual is a gift and blessing from God to help us in this effort. I ask the congregation for its consideration and support in calling him to share in this work, and the wonderful faith community that is Prince of Peace.

Upcoming Building Repair Projects Update

Matthew 16:18 And I tell you, you are Peter, and on this rock I will build my church, and the gates of hell shall not prevail against it.

Matthew tells us that the church built upon a rock shall prevail against the gates of hell. Matthew does not mention that proper maintenance and sometimes largescale projects are required to keep the church in good repair. Of course Matthew was writing about the big 'C' Church and not the physical structures.

I am writing to update and advise you on the two largescale projects that have become necessary at Prince of Peace.

Electrical Feeder Replacement

As you are aware, last summer BGE informed us that we must replace the underground electrical feeders that provide power to the buildings. While BGE will actually replace the underground feeders, PoP is responsible for all of the work required to make this possible.

PoP's work includes excavation of a portion of the driveway and parking lot, installation of underground conduits, an outside concrete pad and miscellaneous electrical equipment both inside and outside of the building.

The PoP Property Committee currently has a professional engineering firm looking into the code requirements and will provide written direction regarding the work so we may obtain final bids. The anticipated cost of the work is approximately \$75,000.

Exterior Waterproofing and Foundation Drain Repairs

Over the years, the three buildings (Day Care, the original church including Ellenberger Hall, and the Sanctuary) have suffered from water infiltration during rains. Water penetrates the below grade walls on all three structures. Additionally, rain water runoff sheets from the parking lot toward the buildings that are at the low end of the lot. We have considered two different approaches to remedy these problems: a negative side (interior) solution and a positive side (exterior) solution.

The interior solution consists of a network of interior drains and (up to) eight sump pumps similar to what you may have in your basement at home. The storm water would then be pumped from inside the building to drains outside the building.

The exterior solution also requires new drains which would be installed around a portion of the outside perimeter of the buildings at the basement level and piped to the Baltimore County storm system. The walls will be waterproofed and rain water would be managed outside of the buildings and not allowed to come inside like a sump pump system would allow.

The two methods have been analyzed and the exterior approach has been selected as the preferred method, as water will be drained away from the building and not allowed to pass through the walls, which over time will deteriorate the concrete and block walls.

We have met with contractors to obtain pricing for both methods. Competitive bids are still being solicited for the exterior solution, but a price tag of approximately \$250,000 is expected.

Project Phasing

Ideally, the waterproofing project should be done before the electrical work begins. Since new drains will be placed below the location where the new concrete pad and electric meter will be installed, performing the waterproofing project first will be less disruptive and less expensive.

Financial

Before making any financial commitments, we will coordinate with the Finance Committee for direction.

Next Update

Look for periodic updates as new information becomes available and as the work is scheduled.


SOCIAL MINISTRY
