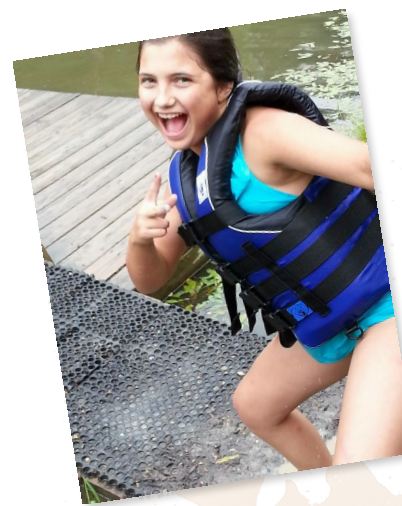
We hope you are excited about this summer as we are! There are a few things you might like to know...

High Hill Camp needs YOUR help!

There are many projects around the camp that need to be completed. Would you consider gathering a group of volunteers from your church to spend some time at camp? We have all types of projects-- some require very little skill, others require special skills in carpentry. Maybe your church or Sunday school class would like to go a step further and adopt a project, providing the laborers and some or all of the funding for the project!

Here are just a few examples of the many projects that are available:

- Clear walking trail around the lake.
- Haul firewood and burn brush from around the lagoon.
- Clear small trees from lake levy.

Here are some that will require materials and their approximate cost:

- Rebuild water distribution building \$2000
- Install siding, window shutters, and doors on wilderness cabins \$1500 each (3)
- Install siding, window, door, and metal roof on paintball storage building \$1500
