ANOTHER ADVENT TRADITION

In much of the Spanish-speaking world, a custom called "Posadas" is practiced. "Posadas" means "shelter" or "lodging," and it is done from December 16-24. A group of people re-enact Joseph and Mary's journey from Nazareth to Bethlehem. They plan a route and travel from house to house, asking for lodging. Each home plays the role of "innkeeper" and refuses to host them. At the last house, everyone is invited inside for prayer and refreshments.

P2P (PASTOR TO PEOPLE) - CHRISTMAS GIFTS



Last week I talked about giving and receiving Gifts. This week as we focus on the Gifts of Christmas, we will examine how gifts can't be earned. Now you might say well isn't that obvious!

We live in a culture that tells us we,

- can get what we want when we want it. Think instant satisfaction.
- deserve it
- earned it

God's word tells us the exact opposite of what culture teaches. Gifts are by nature something you receive and give without any connection to earning it, deserving it, or wanting it. Let's think about the gift we receive in Jesus Christ. John 1:12 tells us, "But to all who did receive him, who believed in his name, he gave the right to become children of God,". So, what does it mean to "receive him" and how this makes us "children of God." Paul's words in Ephesians 2:4-9 clarifies this by telling us that "it is my grace you are saved, through faith. And this is not your own doing; it is the gift of God," which means we receive Him (one part of what a gift means) not based on earning it but based on being given to us freely. You become a child when you are born into a family (can't earn that!). You identify with that family because you receive who you are within that family (i.e., son, daughter). In God's kingdom you can't earn it, won't ever deserve it, and can't happen because I want it. It is all by God's grace (unmerited favor) thus an amazing gift. As you continue to learn about and worship Jesus Christ this Advent be reminded that it is all a gift.
