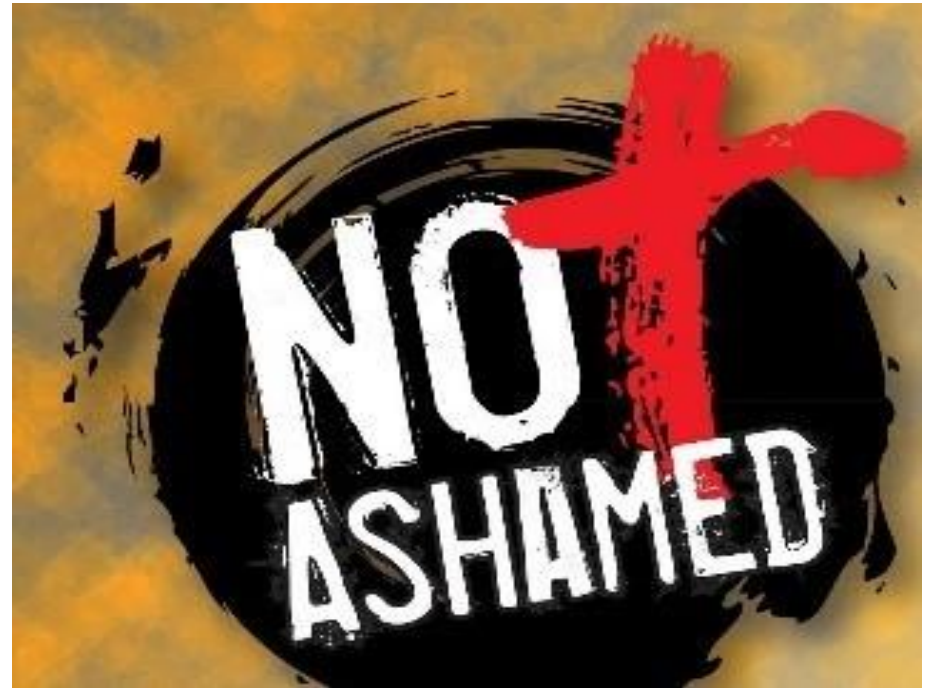

I remember as a child being encouraged to listen more and talk less. Honestly, it took me a long time to heed that wise advice. Listen more and talk less. However if all I did was listen more and talk less I would be missing the greatest commandment ever: "And you shall love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind and with all your strength.' 31 The second is this: 'You shall love your neighbor as yourself.'" (Mark 12:30-31). So, if we put listening together with the Great Commandment, we begin to realize that listening is a great way to love God and others. When we listen to God's word, we will be filled with his truths which are always loving (Exodus 20:1-17). As a church family we can love one another by listening to each other.
