### Musings from PJ (Pastor John)

In 2006 a medical study revealed that close to 600,000 people had heart bypass surgery that year. They were counseled by their doctors that post surgery; they must change their lifestyle in terms of smoking, drinking and diet. They must exercise regularly and work toward reducing stress in their life. In a blunt sort of way, the doctors are saying 'change or die'. You would think that most people would heed the doctor's voice and change their lifestyle. The study discovered that over the next two years ninety percent of these heart patients make no noticeable changes in the way they lived their lives. How does that strike you? Though they knew it was killing them, ninety percent remained living the status quo instead of seeking to change in order to live. An obvious question to be asked is, "Am I (are you) choosing life?" Are we seeking to change our life in such a way that our lives will flourish?

In Deuteronomy 30 Moses is on the eve of his death and Israel is on the threshold of entering the Promised Land. Moses goes to great length to describe for Israel the blessings of following God and the curses of following the gods of their neighbors. Moses concludes his conversation in verse 19, by calling on Israel to

"Choose life, so that you and your children may live."

His statement rings as true today as it did when it was first said. One of the ways (and there are many ways) we choose life with God is by paying attention to what God is doing in our life.

Here are three questions to ponder:

- 1. How have you noticed God in your life of late?
- 2. Are you becoming more aware of God's presence and his nudges in your life?
- 3. What are you doing in response to noticing God and his nudges? How we answer these questions are going to determine if and how our lives flourish with God.

I've been on board four weeks now and as we continue this journey of faith together my greatest desire for myself, for you and for our church is that we would choose life with God. By choosing life with God we become people who are and will flourish in this life and in the life to come.

We also heard from Sheriff Chris Kaber about being ready for winter driving. He emphasized the AAA website for basic tips, but also talked about the necessity of giving ourselves enough time to go places, winter roads are not a good place for hurrying. He mentioned having some weight in the back of your car or truck...a big bag of dog food or bird seed, or lead weights all work to give more traction. Remember to keep a bit of water, food, warm blankets and coats and winter boots in the car so you can manage if you have to stop and wait for a long time. One more thing that Sheriff Kaber said was "that he never drives anywhere on less than 1/2 tank of gas, and that you always want to be prepared for anything. And if you have gas in your tank, you can stay warm longer. Be prepared!" Again, Sheriff Kaber pointed us to the Triple A website for good information about winter driving and being prepared for icy, wet, and snow-packed roads.



Session Meeting October 19, 2017 Summary:

Present: Rich Touslee, Craig Rappe', Don Boyd, Keith Stone, Heidi Neel Biggs, Laura Stewart, Dave Pollard, Barb Dehlinger & Pastor John Geiter

The meeting was opened with prayer by Pastor John at 7pm. A devotion was led by Pastor John. A discussion of Children's Ministries was lead by Belinda Scalas, talking about plans, the responses to the Parents' Survey, and the hopes to hire a Children's Ministry Director. Personnel will meet in the next week to finalize a job description so that the job can be advertised. For the present this will be a part time job with hopes to make it full time by the beginning of 2019.

The agenda was approved with additions and the minutes of the last meeting were approved as presented. Communion was served on October 1, 2017. The next Session meeting will be November 16, 2017 at 7pm.

The last payment to PCUSA has been made. Concern was raised about getting a "Paid in Full" statement from them. Pastor John will follow up on this.

A discussion of the speakers for Minute for Mission was held, Jonna Reeder, a missionary that we support will speak this coming Sunday. Then in November Don Boyd will speak about Physical Resources, in December Mitch Stokes will speak about the Endowments, in February Keith Stone will speak about Personnel.

A discussion of the organizational chart followed and it is still not a finished product. Elder assignments for committees will be finalized next month, with elders bringing preferences and passions so that assignments reflect the elder's concerns.

The current advertising was discussed, and the current contract will not be renewed. Nominating Committee needs to gear up and this will be addressed at the November meeting. Several reports were reviewed, Deacons, Finance, Budget, Physical Resources, Worship, Mission, and Personnel were all discussed and filed as no action was needed.

Under new business we discussed the ushering situation and still feel the need for a few volunteers, especially for the traditional service. Training will be provided. The traditional meeting of the deacons and elders was set back to January, details will be provided at a later date as they become available.

John will be planning his installation, details will be available at a later date. Plans for the annual stewardship campaign were discussed. A letter will go out to the congregation about November 1, 2017 with November 19 selected as Pledge Sunday.

Mitch Stokes offered an idea about a food box project during the holidays, we will have a canned food drive to help fill the boxes, around Thanksgiving or just after.

We will be participating in a live nativity scene with Woodland Lighting as a part of the Snowflake Festival.

The meeting was adjourned with prayer at 9:33pm Session notes supplied by Elder Barb Dehlinger
