Kristin's Background:

Pastor Kristin was born in Frankfurt, Germany while her father was in the army and then moved to Georgia, Michigan and Indiana, all before she was five years old. Growing up in Indiana, her first job was as a child studio recording artist. She worked with the Gaithers, Sandi Patty, and several business commercial projects. Kristin later earned a Bachelor of Arts from Anderson University with a major in German, with an emphasis in Mass Communications and History. During college, she studied at the Goethe Institute in Prien am Chiemsee and at the University of Vienna.

Following a call to enter ministry, she completed her Master of Divinity in 2003 at Anderson University School of Theology and completed her Doctor of Divinity at George Fox in Portland, Oregon with Rev. Dr. Leonard Sweet. Her particular area of research resulted in the published dissertation, Fingerprints Of God: Change And Innovation At Work In The Church, concerning innovation in business, global government, and the church. If you want to be really official, you can call her Rev. Dr. Kristin Longenecker. But she does prefer Kristin or Pastor Kristin.

In addition to working in the church, she has worked in radio, voice over studio work, website management, nonprofit fund development, concessions in a movie theater, hostessing at an upscale organic restaurant, and of course, retail. Kristin has been serving the church in ministry since 1998 in Indiana, California, and Arizona. She specializes in preaching, teaching, counseling, and worship. Her two daughters, Heidi (eleven years and finishing fifth grade) and Anna (eight years and finishing second grade), are in the Kyrene School District.



I was among 237 pastors and congregation leaders at a 7 day Stephen Leader's Training Course in Anaheim, California in February. Participants came from 27 states, Canada, Japan and China. In total 30 churches were there.

I found the LTC to be an engaging, energizing, learning, worshipful, relation building experience, and was able to catch a glimpse of all that Stephen Ministry can be for a congregation and the community at large. It was a highlight seeing people from dozens of denominations set aside their differences for 7 days and become unified in a single mission: how to bring Christ's healing love to hurting individuals.

Stephen Ministry gives DFUMC an effective way to train and organize members to provide one-on-one Christian care to individuals facing a life challenge like grief, divorce, loneliness, relocation, hospitalization, terminal illness, or unemployment. The need for this type of care greatly exceeds what pastors alone can provide. All Christians are called to care for and love one another—it's not just the pastor's job. By equipping our lay people we can help them fulfill their calling as Christians and also expand the amount of caring ministry available through DFUMC.

Judy and her four children were referred to Family Promise when her money ran out after an extended hotel stay. She was recently separated from her husband and homeless for the first time in her life. "The referral service sent me to a number of shelters, but I was so shocked at how my family would be broken up. I was frightened to leave my two young sons alone in a place like that, so I started to plan how we could all sleep in my car." Since there are five of them, she figured two of them would sleep in the trunk. "I keep blankets in the car, so I was all prepared. I was so happy when we found Family Promise." Judy continues, "We could stay together and there was help with

making plans to get back on our feet. And my children really enjoyed the volunteers that welcomed us to the churches, especially the kids. It meant so much to them at a very scary time in their life." Today, Judy and her children are successfully living independently. She is working and the children are all in school and doing well..
