
Sunday, December 25th


Women's Saturday Study Group

Desert Southwest Annual Conference

Reflections on 2016 Annual Desert Southwest Conference - Infuse

I had the privilege along with Suzanne Rudolph to attend the 2016 Annual Conference representing Desert Foothills UMC. The theme of the gathering was INFUSE continuing on from Inspire and Ignite in previous years. The scripture theme was John 15:5 "I am the vine and you are the branches."

Gatherings are always a mixed blessing for me -- I am enough of an introvert that the number of people can become overwhelming. But, there are so many opportunities to grow through the messages from the Bishop and others during the 4 days of meetings.

On day 1 Bishop Bob started infusing oil with peppers in jars. This was an object lesson in how time adds to the infusion. The jars were given to the District Superintendents at the end of the meeting as a reminder to infuse their clergy and laity throughout the coming year. A second lesson about infusion used an illustration with teabags; Passion, Awake and Calm were the characteristics in our own lives on which the discussion focused.

Holy Huddles provided an opportunity for us to discuss around our tables with others the ideas being presented. It gave an opportunity for us to learn from those in other parts of the conference, serving different communities and facing similar yet different challenges. We learned about ways pastors and faith families were making a difference in their communities.

As you probably know, there are continuing tensions in the United Methodist Church around questions of loving and ministering to ALL. I would invite you to read the resources provided on the conference website with the body of the resolution passed.

<http://www.desertsouthwestconference.org/resolution-for-full-inclusivity>. I do not expect that our congregation would not have the same concerns expressed in the debate that day. The controversy has grown with the election of Bishop Karen Olivetto by the Western Jurisdiction. May God grace us with kindness in speaking with one another in this area of controversy.

This is a challenging time for all of us as we listen for the Spirit to infuse our work in the world. Many of us will have concerns. I am confident that God's Spirit will be available as we learn to open our hearts to one another and to the Creator who gives us life. My personal prayer is that I might increase in my ability to love and dwell in holy living with my Lord and Savior.

Desert Foothills Supports Family Promise





Latest News From Fuente de Vida

Below you will find a letter shared from Peggy Thornhill containing the latest news from Fuente de Vida, our sister church in Agua Prieta, Mexico.

Fuente de Vida News, May- Aug. 2016

Dear friends and partners in God's work in Agua Prieta, This last 3 months have been filled with blessings. One of the first things I want to say is the biggest THANK YOU ever to all who helped in getting my van replaced. Special thanks go to Vista de la Montaña, St Marks, and Catalina UMC's in Tucson, Desert Foothills UMC in Phoenix, and Faithworks Missions in Flagstaff, and several individual donors who wish not to be named.

On the last day of April we celebrated Mexico's annual Children's day with a jumping castle, games and prizes, face painting, and food. Games, prizes, and food were provided by Desert Foothills UMC and gift bags for each child from St. Marks. Thank you both so very much.

On Mother's day, the ladies of Fuente de Vida shared in a very good dinner. The meal was prepared and served by men of the church who had a fun time cooking together. The ladies also received gift boxes which were filled with personal and helpful items and sent to us by Desert Foothills UMC in Phoenix.

We are still having our church doors open for prayer at 5 AM every day of the first week of each month with from 15-24 members joining in prayer and praise.

We had the medical group from Faithworks with us again on May 20th and 21st to bless us with free Dr. visits for all who come to our clinic door. Serving our people this time were 2 doctors, Dr. Austin and Dr. Mat Wise, and our dentist Dr. Ada Orozco. We also had a volunteer local physical therapist Francisco working along with us and Irma Cazares, Director of DIF (Desarollo Integral de la Familia- family medical services) helping in the pharmacy. Care was given to 255 patients in these 2, nine hour, days.

Then in June, our Faithworks partners from Flagstaff brought down and delivered to DIF, via Irma Cazares, a very special wheelchair for a young child who has never been able to walk.

Over these past few years The Lord has blessed us with good relationship with both DIF and the City Hospital here in Agua Prieta. As a result of this I (Gela) have been asked by the Sonora State Advisor to City Hospital to join their newly established steering committee. The committee is working on obtaining medical school interns in order to increase their patient care capacity. In order to have a place for the interns to stay, a vacant house on hospital property is being prepared and we will be helping to find furniture-especially twin beds for this.

In celebration of Father's Day we had a party for the Dads and families in the patio next to my house with a seafood buffet. Our families brought big trays of mixed seafood from a favorite restaurant here. Each father also received a gift bag full of special men's things. The gifts were provided by St Marks UMC in Tucson and are so greatly appreciated. The end of June and beginning of July were very busy with school ending and other activities. In my own house, my daughter, Nahara, graduated from Jr. High School on June 29th and on July 1 My son, Diego, graduated from High school.

On July 2nd 3rd and 4th, the district Methodist Women's Division meeting at was hosted at Fuente de Vida with our Bishop and District Superintendent attending. The women of Fuente de Vida hosted the delegates who attended from other towns.

The next 4 days Armando, pastor Kiko, Nahara and I attended Annual Conference in Tijuana.

Vacation Bible school was held from August 8th to 14th with 109 students. This time we have also participating with us an education team from Agua Prieta Police Dept. Who are teaching the kids about what to do if you are being abused and what child abuse actually is. A group of church members were praying for the team. When the course was finished each child was given a Bible also. About a week later I found an article in a local newspaper about the program and the fact that it was held at Fuente de Vida.

We never know what God is going to do next-- the next week one member of the teaching team came to church with his 2 sons and the boys both gave their hearts to Jesus Christ.

In the past year or so we have received many books for adults and children in Spanish and we are planning to make a Library of the small room at the west end of the mobile building that was our original sanctuary. To enable people to sit and enjoy reading, we are planning to have some comfortable chairs in the area next to the book room. We have been blessed with the funds to replace the cooler in this mobile building since we use it so much for classes and meetings. We thank St Marks UMC in Tucson for making this possible.

Speaking of books and things, we have received a large shipment of school supplies and backpacks from our friends and coworkers of Vista de la Montana UMC in Tucson for the children of Fuente de Vida. Several of our students in college have also received funds from Vista de la Montana's scholarship program. This has been a blessing to so many of our High school graduates.

Just before school started the ladies of the church prepared 150 fully stocked book bags for all students in the church. (Kindergarten thru college)

One bigger thing we need to tell you. Armando, Paloma-our praise song leader went to South Korea for "United Prayer Rising", an international call for youth intercessors. This event was realized in The First Methodist Church and partially sponsored by this church. The meeting was focus on pray for the emerging generation and for the unification of both Koreas. Actually there was a pray day in the demilitarized zone in the border with North Korea.

There is so much more to tell and so many blessings to share. We would love to have you come and see us and share in the Lord's work.
