# Alternative Gift Giving

#### Habitat for Humanity



DFUMC is participating in a Phoenix building coalition called the Mighty United Methodist Coalition, which began in 1985. This Advent you are invited to join a fundraising project which focuses on blessings most of us take for granted. If you want to participate, you will receive a paper bank that looks like a Habitat house and a special Advent calendar. How does this work? For example, on December 4, it's suggested you put 25 cents in the bank for each room in your home that is carpeted. On December 14, you're asked to deposit 10 cents for each electrical outlet in your home. You can also just put a bill in the bank and forget the calendar!

Kay Norton will collect Habitat house banks at the three Christmas Eve Services (and after Christmas) and will forward all funds to the Mighty UMC Coalition. The total raised will be linked to our Church. Two builds are planned in which our Coalition can participate: one soon in Glendale and one in Tempe in the spring. Kay can tell you more about the builds themselves, but the building work takes place on Saturdays from 7:30 am to about 2:30 pm.
