# From the Desk of Pastor David Maxfield

Dear Friends in Christ,

The days grow shorter, the wind is colder, the harvest is in, it must be November. More than a holiday, November is a month of **Thanksgiving.** Consider,

All Saints Celebration-Nov. 6 As baptized disciples of Jesus, all who live in faith are saints. During worship we will remember those from our congregation who have died in the Lord and rest in peace. We will also remember and light a candle of prayer for the "saints" of our lives who have shared the light of God's love with us. They are family members and friends, co-workers and neighbors for generation upon generation all the way back to the disciples. That is an awesome thought, and really beyond comprehension. #### Synod Endowment Fund News...

Your Synod Endowment Fund has received over \$2.2 million in gifts. Thanks for your generosity and your investment in the future of ministry in this synod. The Endowment Fund has two branches – the Ministry Fund and the Mission Fund.

Gifts to the Ministry Fund provide financial support to people from Western North Dakota who enter seminary. Some may become Pastors – others may become Deacons with the church. These gifts are also helping to provide some help with debt buy down for church leaders who are called to serve in Western North Dakota.

Gifts to the Mission Fund help provide seed money for Christ-centered ministries. Through these funds, we are able to help sustain several important ministries and encourage outreach experiments on our territory.

These funds have grown over the past several years because of the support, commitment, and vision of people within this synod. Know that your gifts are making a difference – so, Thanks! You are blessing others.

#### Gains Captured...

The gifts given to the Endowment Funds are invested according a policies established over the past 25 years. Each October, the Endowment Fund Committee meets and one of their items of business is to capture gains. The gains come either from interest earned on the investments or an increase in value of the investment. This year, the committee was able to capture \$81,500. Wow!

What this means is that together, we – your Synod – will have \$81,500 to help support seminary education and debt buy down, support mission outreach within our territory, and continue the work of growing the Endowment Fund. Thanks, again!

#### How does the Fund Work...

The principle behind your Synod Endowment Fund is really simple – all gifts given to the fund are investments. Those gifts earn interest and rise in value (gains). The financial gift that you give is never given away; it continues to earn interest or increase in value. This means that a gift given today will continue to provide for ministry for generations to come.

#### Tax Advantages Available for Some Gifts...

A gift of \$5,000 or more to either the Ministry Endowment or the Mission Endowment portion of the Fund may earn you a state tax credit. Depending on your individual tax obligation, that same gift might also earn you a federal tax advantage. Synod staff would be glad to share more information about the funds.

#### Fall Assignment Process...

This fall the Western North Dakota Synod was blessed to receive the name of one recent seminary graduate who is available for call. That candidate has just started the call process with two congregations in our synod.

#### Discernment Dinner...

Are you wondering if God is calling you to serve within the church? On Friday evening, November 18<sup>th</sup>, the Synod Candidacy Committee will be hosting a discernment dinner. This is a time to come and chat with people about call, ask questions about the process, hear about options for seminary education, and listen to others' stories of call.

There is no obligation; you won't be bugged or badgered – but you will get a chance to engage deep questions with people who care. If you know someone you believe should be at this dinner – tell them about it, pray for them, and encourage them to attend.

#### Who Might You Pray for...

Future leaders for God's church will come from our congregations. They will come out of our youth groups, our Bible studies, and our confirmation classes. They will come from our campus ministries and our Bible Camps. If you know of someone you believe has the gifts for ministry – begin to pray for them. Pray for God's guidance and the stirring of the Spirit. Prayer is always the place to begin. Then wait and see what God might do.

Give thanks to the Lord, for he is good; his love endures forever.

Psalm 107:1

Change seems to be the theme for life in Williston once again. Throughout all of the changes Psalm 107 comforts us as we remember God is with us every second of every day. At Community Connections we decided to see the change in leadership at churches, schools, and our city as an opportunity. An opportunity to become a community that works together to provide the best possible care of people in need.

When Community Connections first began there were people arriving everyday looking for work. These were people from all over the United States that were looking for hope. They hoped to provide for their families, maybe even save their homes from foreclosure, hoped to find a community where they can feel valued, and in many cases hoped for a community where they will feel their families are welcomed. Unfortunately, in some cases they would arrive on the bus or train with few or no resources. They would be able to find work in a short period of time but had not realized how high the cost of living was going to be.

This past year we have experienced an economic downturn which in turn caused the Advisory Board of Community Connections to rethink what we can do for the community. The downturn meant that agencies and churches had to make the difficult decision to have less available for assistance to families in need. Yes, we were having fewer people arriving without a secure job but we began to have people come to churches and agencies feeling much more desperate. The people had gone from making a good living and providing for their families to either being laid off or having their work hours cut drastically. There were fewer people coming for assistance but their needs were deeper. Their concerns were how to pay their mortgage or rent, how to feed their family and how to pay their utility bills.

During the spring and summer there were leadership changes at eight area churches and in seven key leadership roles in our city. We decided this was our opportunity to make connections with the new leadership to have conversations about how best to care for the families we served. On September 7 Community Connections partnered with Job Service ND to hold a lunch for new leadership and employers that were beginning to hire again. Nine Social service agencies including Community Action Partnership, Salvation Army, Veterans Administration, and Family Crisis Shelter presented information about the services they provide and we had conversation about the needs in the city of Williston.

We have also held conversations with new clergy in Williston about working better together. We are moving toward Community Connections becoming a central hub for churches. To prepare for this possibility we have received a generous grant from the Deaconess Community of the ELCA which has allowed us to welcome Sandy Winter to the staff as Case Worker. Sandy meets with clients to access their needs and make referrals. As the fall progresses we will be meeting with pastors and other church leaders to discuss how best to accomplish the goal of a more centralized care for people. Watch for progress reports in the near future.
