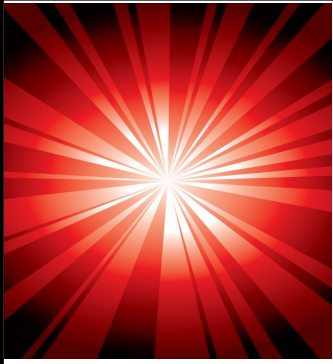

Dear Friends in Christ,

Epiphany! Those sudden moments of insight, Aha, and wows that explode upon our mind.

Epiphany! A manifestation or showing of the divine such as on Mount Sinai, the visit of the Three Wiseman, the Mountain of Transfiguration, and the Upper Room.

Epiphany! A season of insight and discovery as God wows and wonders us with signs of his presence long ago and among us today.

I am excited to invite you into a Epiphany Exploration during the months of January and February. We will begin where our god-journey begins in the water and promise of Baptism on January 7-8. For the next two months we will explore the book of Acts together in worship and in partnered Bible Study as we ask some very important questions together:

1. What is God up to in this reading?
2. What is the intent of God in this reading? What is the intent of the people in this reading? Are they the same, are they at odds?
3. Where do you see God using people in this reading? Who are they? How would you describe them? How are they like you?
4. How did God surprise you in this reading?
5. What might this reading say to the Church today, to Gloria Dei, and to you?

Each week, beginning January 8th, 2 chapters of the Book of Acts will be shared in worship, online and mailed to those who request it.

Every week I ask that you read the two chapters and ponder the five questions.

Every week, I ask that you meet with a study partner for 30 minutes to share your insights, questions and pray for our ministry together here at Gloria Dei.

Every week, share your insights with each other at Coffee hour or on the boards in the Gathering Space.

On Sunday, February 26th, come to a **noon Pot-luck** after worship and we will share our **Epiphanies** drawn from prayer, study and conversation. We will spend some time thinking, praying and discerning what God is saying to us and calling us to do we walk by faith.

Individuals, couples, singles, families, young and old I invite you to this adventure of faith and Aha! Moments. I am confident that your faith will deepen, you will begin to see God active in your life in ways you never thought possible, and...., well let's leave that one open for the Holy Spirit.

The **Epiphany!** Bible study is the first step in our congregational renewal process. Our ministry is grounded in prayer, Bible Study and listening — to God, others and our community. As we do this we will discern together glimpses of God's dream and mission for our congregation. I am excited to open God's Word with you in this special way in the coming weeks. I know you will have questions, so will I, so let's talk, and let's open our heart and minds to Epiphany! Those moments of insight and aha! When God bursts into our midst.

A Monthly Update from the Synod Office

Lord, what would you have us do???

Happy New Year! What are your plans? The beginning of the year is like a painter with a blank canvas in front of them, there are endless opportunities to live the Good News of Jesus Christ in your community.

The beginning of the year is the perfect time of year for a church council and rostered leaders to lead the congregation in setting goals for ministry together. Some great questions to talk about are:

-What is the most important thing we do as a congregation?

(Believe it or not looking at your congregational constitution can be helpful because it defines why your congregation exists.)

-Since time is a limited resource, how do we want to encourage members of the congregation to spend their time in faith-building activities?

-How will our congregation help people deepen their faith in Jesus?

-What can our congregation do to help people connect their faith and daily life?

You will notice this is a forward looking activity, pushing the council and pastor to lead conversation, listen closely and to be responsible for setting a course for the congregation.

Can we really dream a new dream???

Filling a blank canvas begins with noticing. What has changed in your community? In your congregation? What are the resources God has provided? Assets are more than money, they include people, your space, equipment, and financial resources. What are the passions of people around you?

Someone much smarter than I has written that God has provided us with absolutely everything we need to do the ministry God has set before us. In other words, God is not expecting us to do anything that God has not already provided the tools with which to accomplish the ministry.

All of this is about sharing the Jesus story with others. We do it through our words and our actions. Our churches exist to "Tell the old, old story..." both within our congregations and through the people who are the members.

Annual Review...

Believe it or not what you do at the beginning of the year to lay out the priorities and goals of your ministry is the starting point of an end of the year annual review. Synod staff often get phone calls in late November or early December asking if we have material to help a council do pastoral evaluations. Evaluations are best done when congregation and leaders have spent time setting goals – it is in light of those goals or priorities that our ministry together is evaluated.

Evaluation helps a congregation access what has been done well, where have positive steps been taken, what did not work well. It allows us to ask why some things worked well and others did not.

Synod Council to Meet...

The Western North Dakota Synod council will meet February 10 & 11 in Minot. If you have items that you believe should be addressed by council give me a call.

At this meeting your synod council will be making adjustments to the 2017 budget and approving a budget for 2018 which will be presented to Synod Assembly for conversation. We will also engage conversation around openings in our synod and talk about raising up new leaders.

Constitutional Changes...

At the end of November notice was sent to all of our congregations about proposed changes to the synod constitution. Those changes will be voted on at our synod assembly this coming June. Please take time to review the documents. A link to the documents can be found on the front page of the synod web site.

Community Connections

Working together to be a community where all people are valued.

“Baby, it’s cold outside.” These are very familiar song lyrics made famous by Nate King Cole. This time of year we know that to be very true here in Williston, ND. The cold weather also means there are more people coming to Community Connections for assistance. We are currently providing assessment of clients for six churches in Williston. In September we saw 36 clients, 8 of which were homeless, that requested help with 56 needs. In October we saw 54 clients, 9 of which were homeless, requested help with 68 needs. In November 56 people came to us with 102 needs. Nine of those 56 were homeless. As of this writing, December 8 we have met with 23 clients, 4 of which are homeless, that have requested help with 34 needs. The assistance people are asking for includes food, rent, lodging, utilities, medicine, gasoline and a whole variety of other needs.

In many cases we are seeing people that had jobs or came here because they feel they had been promised a job and are now finding themselves without employment and no place to live or in danger of losing their home. With no emergency shelter and resources at both churches and social service agencies stretched the word cold takes on two meanings. Community Connections not only provides guidance to resources but also a welcoming place where someone will take the time to listen. Many of the people we see come in feeling desperate and scared. It is one of our goals they leave our office feeling calmer and cared for.

We conducted a survey of all churches in Williston this past fall. We asked each church two questions. Do you provide anything special for Thanksgiving or Christmas for people in need?” and “If so, what is it you provide?” We created a flyer with a listing of what was available and it was sent out to all the churches and social service agencies.

We are also very busy planning for the Point In Time Count scheduled for the end of January. This a nation-wide count of people living without adequate shelter or outside conducted by the Department of Housing and Urban Development. Community Connections serves as the area coordinator for the ND Coalition for Homeless People and will be coordinating with social service agencies, churches and others that serve people in need to conduct a count of people living without adequate shelter. We will be asking for volunteers to help with the effort. Watch the church bulletin for ways you can be part of this important day or contact us at 701-713-6783 or communityconnectionswilliston@outlook.com.

As we enter a new year it is customary to reflect on the year that just passed and look to the future. At Community Connections we serve people in need to help them look toward a future filled with the hope of Christ. We also pray you live in our Lord’s hope every day.
