As you're reading this, we are getting close to the midpoint of **Community Bible Experience**: reading through the New Testament together! Congratulations...and don't give up, keep going! The three slogans above really say it all:

READ **BIG**. Reading 10-12 pages each day is a lot! But if your experience is like mine, it takes your understanding of the Bible – God's story – to a whole new level. Reading large sections helps your understanding because of the larger context. Instead of reading a verse or a couple of verses pulled out of their surrounding story, you're seeing how everything fits together: the action fits with the parables or dialog; the characters become more real as you watch them following—or fighting—Jesus. All of this helps pull you and me into the story – we sense where we would find ourselves if we were there in the crowds, or with the disciples, or in a one-on-one conversation with Jesus. **Reading BIG is powerful.**

READ **REAL**. Because we're taking in so much of God's story each day, the Holy Spirit is able to speak to us in personal, deep ways. Suddenly this isn't just a story long ago, it's real to our daily lives and circumstances. We start to identify with those in the story—they become very real to us, and applying what we're reading to our own lives starts happening more naturally. **Reading REAL is up close and personal.**

READ **TOGETHER**. This is how the first believers in Jesus heard these words. They listened together in small groups, or in worshiping in their homes or other gathering places. As these gospels or letters were read, they discussed them together, learned together, and prayed together for wisdom to follow Jesus—together—more faithfully.

Our five discussion questions have no doubt led to engaging conversations in your small groups. Reading together saves us from the sin of pride: "I know all the answers" – but also the sin of doubt – "I'll never understand the Bible as well as other Christians." Instead we are encouraged and strengthened because—reading together and sharing together—we become the body of Christ, helping one another gain wisdom and follow Jesus more faithfully! **Reading TOGETHER "bears much fruit".**

If you've struggled with this, if you've fallen behind—don't give up! Just check your bookmark and start reading again with today's assigned pages. God will honor the time you invest. Pray and ask the Holy Spirit to help you understand as you read; that's a prayer he will answer! And if you haven't participated in a small group yet, it's never too late to join...all the groups are open to anyone. **You will have something to share—and to receive—that will be a blessing!**




Our 7th and 8th grade Sunday School Class!

CONFERENCE CONNECTIONS

All United Methodist churches are connected through shared mission and ministry and united in their efforts to grow in love of God and neighbor, reach new people, and heal a broken world. Check out these news tidbits from the Minnesota Annual Conference, which serves all 350 United Methodist churches in the state.

- Surprise the World! All-conference Lenten video study: This Lent (Feb. 14-April 1), Bishop Bruce R. Ough invites all Minnesota United Methodists to join in a weekly video study. Beginning Feb. 15, we will post a new video each week based on Michael Frost's book Surprise the World: Five Habits of Highly Missional People, along with a related scripture and reflection questions. We encourage congregations to purchase copies of the book and to form small groups to journey together during Lent.
- Minnesotans provide hope and helping hands in hurricane recovery: United Methodist Early Response Teams (ERT) are volunteers trained to enter disaster-torn areas and provide early recovery help. Two teams traveled from Minnesota to Houston and Dickinson, Texas in November. They helped people whose homes were damaged in Hurricane Harvey. Team members removed sheetrock, ripped out floors, and prepared homes to start the rebuilding process. But the teams also listened to survivors tell stories of loss and recovery, and they offered hope and healing to the people they served. If you feel called to serve after natural disasters, you can attend a training session and join future ERTs. The next training session is Jan. 20. Visit <u>tinyurl.com/mn-umc-ert</u> to learn more.

BRIGHT SPOTS IN OUR MIDST

- Just a drop in the bucket makes a difference: After Hurricane Harvey, Faith UMC in Farmington partnered with the entire town to collect relief supplies for the Texas town of Port Aransas. Farmington sent thousands of dollars in donations and an entire semi-trailer of flood buckets and building supplies to Port Aransas. Pastor Karen Evenson of Faith UMC said, "A small town coming together can be more than a drop in the bucket! And the church can lead the way!" The two towns have now formed a close relationship.
- Emma Norton Services celebrates 100 years of service and advocacy: Emma Norton Services (ENS) in St. Paul partners with women, children, and families who are homeless and experiencing mental illness or chemical dependency. It supports women and families with housing, case managers, and support groups. ENS has served thousands of women throughout its 100-year history. That's largely due to the support of United Methodist Women, an agency of the United Methodist Church that advocates for and supports women and children. United Methodist Women groups in Minnesota provide significant financial and hands-on support to ENS.
- Town of Springfield wins best live nativity in Minnesota: Pastor Josh Doughty of Springfield UMC, who played Joseph, said, "We get people who wouldn't ordinarily come to a church to hear the story be told, and they get to witness in a fun way." The pageant, which has run for 32 years, included camels, a donkey, and many other animals. The participants ranged in age from an infant playing Jesus all the way to an 83-year-old wise man! Viewers of WCCO News voted this pageant as the best in Minnesota.
