

meaning of the Gospel


WORSHIP

We dream of a church where worship is....












GO STRATEGIC GOALS FOR EVANGELISM

- Encourage participation in our annual Missions Convention, planned Mission Trips, as well as connecting with visiting Missionaries
- Continue with Faith Promise giving and teach people to give sacrificially to the cause of World Evangelism







THOSE WE NEED TO REACH

- Tulare population in 2017:62,211 people
- Households in Tulare: 14,517
- Ethnic Majority: 57%Hispanic/Latino
- Population within one mile of church: 6,286 people
- Households within one mile of church: 1,575

TULARE BY THE NUMBERS

- Active in Religious Congregation: 2010 38% 2017 31.25%
- In 2017, 37.25% of people in Tulare strongly agree that Jesus actually rose from the dead.
- In 2017, 47.5% of people in Tulare think that believing in Jesus doesn't require participation in a church.
- In 2010, 3.41% were Pentecostal with 3.09% in 2017. That's a decline of 0.32%
- Christian congregations have declined across the board with the exception of non-denominational churches.
