WHAT HERITAGE ARE YOU LEAVING YOUR CHILDREN?

One Sunday, walking past a Sunday School classroom, I saw something that moved my heart deeply, but at the same time moved me to a point of great concern.

I began to think of my Sunday School heritage. . . memory verses, Bible challenges (or others know it as Bible Drills) to see who could find a verse in the Bible first, gold stars on a chart for being present, bringing offering, bringing my Bible, a star for saying a memory verse, and flannel graph. (Okay, I know many of you have no clue what that is . . . it's a simple cut-out picture—relating to the Bible story that was being taught—that would stick to a flannel covered board which usually sat on an easel). If you had been really attentive in class you got to pick one of the pictures to take home with you along with a Sunday school paper with a story and picture to color. Then there was always promotion Sunday when you moved on up to the next class, a new teacher, and more flannel graph pictures to help the Bible story come alive. (Remember, we didn't have YouTube!) Wonderful days those were. That is where I learned how God created the heavens and the earth, about Daniel and the lion's den, about Noah and the ark, about David and Goliath, Jonah and the whale, and we memorized the books of the Bible . . . all 66, Old and New Testament.

I thank God often for all the times I was taken to Sunday school and church. I wasn't "made" to go, and I wasn't the one who made the decision if I "wanted" to go, it was what we did Sunday mornings. That heritage is a gift in my life to this day.

Here is where I may not be a popular person, and that's okay. You can stop reading here, but my heart is burdened by our passion to give our children so many other things, but it seems like teaching them things of Jesus is far down on the list. We make sure they have the best brand of clothing, participate in every sport or other activity possible, but allow our children to choose what part or how much of church they want.

To the best of our ability we gave many things outside of church life to our boys. They were good things to enhance their lives, but "those things" will not carry them into eternity with a relationship of knowing and loving Jesus.

Not long ago, I learned the heritage of faith goes deep—and generations back—on both sides of my family. Apparently that heritage was passed on because one day it reached this little girl from Illinois in a little church that certainly wasn't pretty. There weren't children's ministries as such, but I learned about Jesus and His love for me. I learned the importance of praying and that Jesus heard my prayers.

I urge you—give your children, your grandchildren, any children under your influence—give them Jesus, the greatest heritage in all of this world. If we gain the world and lose our soul, what a tragedy. If we give our children the world and they lose their soul, what a tragedy.



So, during this Thanksgiving season I am extremely, exceedingly, and humbly thankful to my family, to my parents, for my heritage of faith. Also, to those Sunday school teachers, and my pastors who gave me God's word each Sunday. I'm thankful, oh, so thankful.

I hope you still love me . . . my heart is burdened for our little ones to be in that place, to be taught God's word. Does that guarantee they will always walk the straight and narrow? No, sorry to say it does not, but it does guarantee they will never forget the message implanted in their hearts.
