

MISSISSIPPI POT ROAST

(Submitted by a dear friend)

Ingredients:

- (1) 3-5 lb. chuck roast
- 2 T olive oil (or vegetable oil)
- 1 packet ranch dressing mix
- 1 packet dry onion soup mix
- 1 stick butter (1/2 cup) – REAL salted butter, not margarine
- 8 peperoncini peppers

Place unseasoned roast in slow cooker. Sprinkle packets of dry ranch dressing and onion soup mixes over pot roast. Top with a stick of butter. Then place peppers on and around roast. (Have no fear, the peppers do not make the roast spicy!) Cover and cook on low for 8 hours. You don't need to add any other liquid to this. The meat will create its own juices as it cooks. Just cover and let it do its thing.

Monday, September 3^{re} **Labor Day** is celebrated on the first Monday in September and honors the American labor movement and the contributions that workers have made to the strength, prosperity, laws and well-being of the country. It is also considered the unofficial end of summer.

Tuesday, September 11th **Patriot Day** is observed in memory of the thousands who lost their lives as a result of the September 11, 2001, terrorist attacks against the United States that involved four hijacked planes. The observance also honors those who came to aid in the aftermath. Each year on Patriot Day, the U.S. flag is flown at half-staff. Citizens are asked to observe a moment of silence, usually at 8:46 a.m. EDT (when the first hijacked plane struck the World Trade Center in New York City), and are encouraged to devote the day and year to serving their neighbors and communities.


