ERIN'S PRIZE-WINNING PUMPKIN BREAD

- o 3 cups sugar
- o 1 cup vegetable oil
- o 3 large eggs
- o 116-ounce can solid pack pumpkin
- o 3 cups all-purpose flour
- o 1 teaspoon ground cloves

- o 1 teaspoon ground cinnamon
- o 1 teaspoon ground nutmeg
- o 1 teaspoon baking soda
- o 1/2 teaspoon salt
- o 1/2 teaspoon baking powder
- o 1 cup coarsely chopped walnuts (optional)

Preparation

1. Preheat oven to 350°F. Grease and flour two 9x5x3-inch loaf pans. Beat sugar and oil in large bowl to blend. Mix in eggs and pumpkin. Sift flour, cloves, cinnamon, nutmeg, baking soda, salt and baking powder into another large bowl. Stir into pumpkin mixture in 2 additions. Mix in walnuts, if desired.

2. Divide batter equally between prepared pans. Bake until toothpick inserted into center comes out clean, about 1 hour 10 minutes. Transfer to racks and cool 10 minutes. Using sharp knife,

cut around edge of loaves. Turn loaves out onto racks and cool completely.

SCOUTS HONOR!

Congratulations to Owen Charles Malak of Boy Scout Troop 193 for earning the rank of Eagle Scout! The Eagle Court of Honor recognizing Owen's achievement was held at the Rookery on September 22nd. Owen joined Troop 193 in December of 2012 and has earned an impressive total of 26 merit badges. (A minimum of 21 badges must be earned to attain the Eagle award.) He has held many positions of leadership within the Troop, including Patrol Leader, Librarian, Quartermaster, Senior Patrol Leader and Troop Guide.

During the Eagle Court of Honor, special presentations were made by members of the Troop and Owen's family as well as by Judge Timothy Grendell and Ohio State Representative Diane Grendell. Only 4% of all Boy Scouts earn the rank of Eagle Scout.

Owen was also one of several Scouts from Troop 193 who were featured in a recent article in the Geauga Maple Leaf about their canoeing nearly 80 miles in the Boundary Waters of the Northern Tier High Adventure Base in Ely, Minnestoa this summer.
