Minister's Outlook

Cloudy and 53° (08-21-17) 7:00 a.m.

This will be my last newsletter column. I have either written a column or produced a complete newsletter for the past fifty three years. This column is a mixture of some previous thoughts coupled with my assessment of myself as a minister. I have spent 23 years as a school teacher and 76 years as a classroom student with God as my instructor. Whatever I have become, it has been because I wanted to emulate my Father. Please forgive me when I did not measure up to the task. In the song below, I view myself as "Joe."

School Davs

Somewhere hidden in my fifty three years of newsletter files, I am sure I have quoted the lines from the song, "School Days." It was taught to me by my father, but this beautiful song even pre-dates his education experiences. I like the song because of its spiritual values and also because it is a practical and realistic assessment of a young boy's favorite school days memories. It is still applicable today.

> School days, School days, Good old Golden Rule days, Readin'and writin', 'rithmetic,--Taught to the tune of a hickory stick. You were my queen in calico. I was your bashful bare foot beau. You wrote on my slate, "I Love You, Joe." When we were a couple of kids.

The writer's first memory of his school days is the guiding philosophy of the school itself. He remembers his core subjects and two authorities he respected—the Golden Rule and the hickory stick.

Most schools still uphold the "Golden Rule" concept, but sadly, the concept has lost its sense of under-girding authority. When the song was written, every pupil knew that the "Golden Rule" was applicable because it came from God. If a young man loved God he obeyed the Golden Rule. On the other hand, if a young man did not love God, he still obeyed the Golden Rule because of his FEAR of both the" hickory stick" and God.

Though some of the above thoughts may be in conflict with present day thinking, it is still essential that growing children and admiration for the principle itself, or because they know beyond a shadow of a doubt that they will experience dire consequences administered in love if they disobey. This is one of the most helpful gifts we can bequeath to our children. School ought to be an exciting place of learning.

Finally, the song teaches that school is a place where social norms are shaped. Once having been a boy myself, I can only imagine the excitement of finding written on my slate by the girl of my youthful dreams, "I Love You, Joe." Though my name is not Joe, I have always concluded that Joe was a most fortunate young lad who undoubtedly hurried to school every morning thereafter.

Story Time

"Tell us a story daddy...tell us a story." If I had a dime for every time my children have approached me with that request, I could hire a full-time story teller to keep them entertained. It doesn't matter if it's a story about my childhood, or one that I make up on the spot, my kids love a good story...and who can blame them?

I can still remember some of the stories that my dad shared with me as a child, as they transported me to another place and time. Whether they were stories about his time in the Navy or of some adventure that he experienced in the outdoors, his stories captured my attention as they imbedded themselves within the deep recesses of my mind. In fact, in those moments when my children demand more, and the well of my own experiences runs dry, I often rely on his stories to get me through.

If there's one thing that many preachers are guilty of, it's that they're often great story tellers, who possess the ability to entertain the masses week after week, while at the same time leaving their listeners spiritually empty due to their lack of scriptural content. If there was ever an area where Jesus excelled as a teacher, this was it, as he had mastered the ability of communicating spiritual truths through cleverly contrived stories.

These stories (more appropriately referred to as "parables") comprised much of Jesus teaching. Through them, he instructed the masses, individuals and even his disciples on a whole variety of topics. Though their deeper meanings were not always understood, such tales held his listeners interest and often sparked their curiosity to listen to him all the more.

Over the course of the next three months (mid-September - November) Adam and I will be teaming up to obey a principled standard because it is right--either out of love explore many of these parables with you on Sunday mornings. Although we will be unable to explore all of Christ's parables during this timeframe (given the vast amount of stories that Jesus shared throughout his earthly ministry) our goal is to expound upon as many as possible.

> So if you're up for a good story, that's packed with spiritual truths, then join us this fall as we explore some to of the greatest tales ever told. It's bound to make for a great study!

fake and appreciate people who are real. While results happen slower than in the United States, New Zealanders do respond when they hear the Gospel and lives are transformed.
