Joel, "We are so proud of you and we know that with God in your life all things are possible."

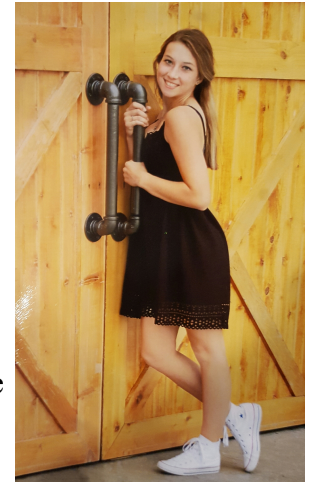
