A Glimpse into the Impact of a Treasure Chest Program

Despite their loyalty and dedication to our worthy cause, many of our donors have never personally experienced the positive impact a visit to the Treasure Chest can have for a childhood cancer patient. Here's a brief glimpse at a typical scene as it unfolded recently at a Chicago area treatment center.

Stepping into a Children's Cancer Treatment Center, one finds myriad emotions from the young patients there. While one young girl sits quietly playing with her doll, elsewhere in the room a teenager curls up on a recliner, looking exhausted. Cancer shouldn't happen to kids. It shouldn't happen to anyone, but it does. These children are fighting to win a war against a horrible disease that wasn't supposed to invade their young bodies.

Nine-year-old Nyiah Young of Frankfort is a fixture in the Clinic Room at Hope Children's Hospital in Oak Lawn, IL. She has been coming here since the age of three, when she suffered a stroke. "The Barbie toys are my favorite," said Nyiah. As she prepares for her next treatment, her father, Carlos, watches her play with her new doll. "Getting something like this makes the day go faster," said Carlos.

As IV's filled with chemical drugs hang by each recliner, another brave young cancer patient walks in. Peeking inside the Treasure Chest is one-year-old Jacob Abraham from Oak Forest. Sporting a bald head as a result of his cancer treatments, Jacob is here more often than most. "He has a different schedule every week," said his mother, Megan Abraham. "Some weeks he is here for five days."

The Treasure Chest Foundation wants to make sure kids like Jacob are kept busy with a toy following their painful treatments. And sure enough, on this day little Jacob has chosen a Thomas train with his visit to the Treasure Chest. He smiles as he prepares to go through his treatment. His mother is glad he won't remember the hard part.

The Treasure Chest Foundation helps put smiles on the faces of toddlers and teens. There are still 27,000 children and teens in our nation who are battling cancer but not currently benefitting from our services. We would love to see the day when every little one going for a cancer treatment is able to visit a Treasure Chest and select a toy following a painful procedure.
