Written by Luke the beloved physician, companion of Paul; Volume 2 of Luke's account (Gospel of Luke is Volume 1); Addressed to Theophilis who may have been his patron (financed him during the writing of the books) Conservative scholars date writing of book between 60-62 ad.

Acts picks up from Luke 24:49-53
