

Why do we learn to read? All educational systems, no matter what language is used, are built on a person's ability to take symbols placed in certain combinations to form words, phrases, sentences, and paragraphs. For most of us, we never asked the question. We just assume the necessity of learning and teaching our children this skill.

We as parents consider it obvious that reading is beneficial to receiving and distributing information. Our children are taught their ABCs and numbers through various learning schemes, and then soon word and picture associations are made. The brain of a child is created so that the process moves along quickly.

God is the first and greatest communicator as he is the Creator who has allowed languages to form. He has chosen to reveal himself through the writers who would communicate truth in written form. Of course, the Scriptures are the main expression of his written revelation given so that we might know him.

All educational systems, whether private or public or homeschooling, place an emphasis on learning vocabulary words, spelling, parts of speech, and basic sentence structure. The Bible should also be included in teaching the reading process. As always, a certain reading level or skill level must be attained before it becomes second nature. But, as adults and parents, we begin by reading the familiar stories of the Bible to children, and helping them follow the words, and the hearing of words pronounced, so eventually, reading becomes a way of knowing God's truth.

Reading is an absolute necessity for our life with God in his creation. Let's use Scripture reading to know God and the abundance of knowledge he offers to us.



Let God be GOD

If your response is, 'Of course!' Don't be too hasty. What does that mean to you? How are you allowing God to be GOD in your life? Does He have access to *ALL* parts in your life... and how - in what ways?

Letting God be God requires you (us) to be attentive to what He says, which means continually reading and <u>studying</u> the handbook (Bible) in order to know. It means spending time with Him in a continual dialogue and not just in stress or crisis.

Bottom line - letting God be God means Trust. Do you trust God in all things regardless of what you see? His word tells us (Jeremiah 29:11) that He has a plan for our hope and future. It tells us (Romans 8:28) that all things work to the good. When you can't find or see the hope, future, good... do you still walk in faith? Do you walk God being God... or do you try to help Him? If you are anything like me, there are times I try to help and typically muddy the water.

Fingernail Faith

A dearly-loved mother is being "kicked out" of a nursing home because of lack of funds. An unfaithful wife is suing for divorce and leaving the state with the children. A man is plagued with disturbing dreams of childhood abuse which fill the nights with terror and pain. Another received the news of the brutal murder of his grandchild. Still another is facing the certainty of never going home, never getting out, never having a real life, never having a real friend. Yet another is labeled for life and fears he may never be able to get a job when he gets out. They are all hanging on to their faith by their fingernails.

We see examples of this kind of faith in biblical characters such as Joseph who was sold into slavery by his traitorous brothers, unjustly accused by his master's wife, serving time in prison for a crime he did not commit, forgotten by people who had promised to remember him. We could look at Jeremiah who was told at the outset of his ministry that it would be a failure because of the hard hearts of the people he had been called to warn. He at one time was thrown into a mud-filled cistern up to his armpits and left to die. We could interview Elijah who ran for his life when a wicked gueen threatened to kill him and he prayed that God would let him die. Job cursed the day he was born after he lost everything he had except three so-called friends who made his wretched life even more miserable.

Does God care when we are at the point of fingernail faith? Does He have any idea of what we are going through? And if He does, why does He allow it? Well, we could look at Jesus in the Garden of Gethsemane as He asked His father if there was any other way to accomplish the redemptive plan without having to face the cross, the sin, the separation, the humiliation, the horror of it all - and He was denied His request. Does He know? Does He care? Will He help? Absolutely! "There is no pit so deep that He is not deeper still," said Betsy ten Boom as she lay dying in a concentration camp. She was right.

Megakites

And He (Jesus) said also to the people, "When you see a cloud rise out of the west, straightway you say, There comes a shower; and so it is. And when [you see] the south wind blow, you say, There will be heat; and it comes to pass."

When we think of science and kites, we usually think of Ben Franklin flying his kite in the thunderstorm. Ben Franklin was not the first to use kites to study the weather. Nor was he the last. The U.S. Weather Bureau began using kites to study the weather after the invention of the box kite in 1893. Kites became important weather station tools for the next 30 years. As balloons were improved, the Weather Bureau's use of kites stopped.

In 1990, meteorologists again returned to the kite. Modern, high-tech materials gave meteorologists the hope of doing research with kites that was impossible with balloons. Modern meteorological kites can be "parked" miles high for weeks. A kite the size of two compact cars can weigh only a pound. Vents in the front of the wing-shaped kite inflate it so that it holds its wing shape. Instruments on the kite send down weather readings from various altitudes along the tether. The world record altitude reached by one of these kites is almost 12 miles!

The creation that God made for us has always inspired man's curiosity and wonder. Unfortunately, many of today's scientists would just as soon ignore God. However, the foundation upon which they build is the scientific accomplishments of earlier scientists who, for the most part, believed in and worshiped our Creator.

Combine and bake as any similar cake.




