## Pastor's Message

A few weeks ago, I announced that Ash Wednesday would be on Valentine's Day. I joked, but was also serious that the best place you could be on Valentine's Day is at Divine Service.

In fact, I often teach things like this. Confirmation classes, Bible study, and premarital counseling. Because I find that Christians, even those who have been members of the Church since birth, frequently follow the advice of our culture rather than that of the Church.

For example, our culture encourages young people to "test drive" their partners to see if they are "sexually compatible." This includes things like cohabitation before marriage, premarital sex, and, in general, acting as though you are married, without being married. Aside from being sinful, and aside from giving the couple false sense of commitment, there are many problems of cohabitation before.

Here's just a few: Cohabitors report higher levels of alcoholism, twice as many episodes of aggression, three times higher rates of depression, more frequent disagreements, more fights and violence, and lower levels of fairness and happiness. Those who got married after premarital cohabitation had greater marital instability, lower marital satisfaction, and poorer communication in marriage, often leading to divorce, which is nearly 50% in our culture. Divorce rates among Christian couples who go to Church and pray with each other frequently is less than .01%. Crazy huh?

My point? Following the advice of our culture with regards to marriage and relationships leads to a coin-flip on whether your marriage will work or not. Following God's Word on your relationships leads to more happiness, more fulfillment, and less problems. This is not to say there aren't exceptions, but why chance it?

So, back to Valentine's Day. What's the best way to celebrate it? Well, practically speaking, restaurants and other attractions will be packed, sitters will be harder to find, Ubers or DDs will be stressed with extra work, and nearly all of the things one can do on Valentine's Day can be done on any day of the year.

And what about the Church? St. Valentine was a Roman priest or Bishop in the 3<sup>rd</sup> century who was martyred on February 14<sup>th</sup>, 269 for ministering to persecuted Christians. While there's nothing wrong with feasting, wining and dining, and participating in marital courtly courtship, if you know what I mean, that is, assuming you are married on the last part, it is fitting to give God thanks for such a man as St. Valentine and to mourn sin's effects on humanity which would lead to such persecution on the day of his commemoration.

What good news than, that on Valentine's Day this year, we have the Divine Service of Ash Wednesday, where you can give thanks to God for His endless grace and lament our sinfulness with the donning of ashes. Furthermore, such attending the Divine Service, such praying, and such feasting on our Lord's Body and Blood, will help to bring lasting happiness and fulfillment to your marriage.

## St. Paul Lutheran Church Quarterly Voter's Meeting Minutes December 10, 2023

(Covers period from Sept 18 to present.)

- 1. Meeting call to order by Chairman Larry Cuklanz. 40 members attended.
- 2. Opening prayer by Pastor Varns.
- 3. Minutes from September quarterly meeting were reviewed. No additions or corrections noted. Motion to approve by Jim Wegner, 2nd by Dorothy Ims, motion carried.
- 4. Financial/Designated reports from November were reviewed. There was discussion on our deficit that continues. If general checking goes below a level of \$1500, funds are transferred from our Thrivent account. Motion made to accept these reports made by Gene Stengel, 2nd by Molly Hoff, motion carried.

#### 5. Pastoral Report

- Regular activities Sunday morning worship service, recorded, edited, and uploaded; Sunday morning Bible Study, Monday morning 8:00 am men's Bible Study, Thursday morning 9:30 am women's Bible Study, pastoral homebound visitations.
- Irregular activities midweek Advent Services 6 pm Wednesdays, ministering and burial for Colton and Emily Ebel's pregnancy loss of their twins.
- A question was brought up: One homebound/nursing home members were listed by Pastor at this time.

#### 6. Membership Report

- Death: Laura Nelson died October 19, 2023 (no pastoral care)
- Confirmed: Dane Paul Hildahl November 26, 2023uHutH
- Released: Cheryl Bohlman and Tricia Chodur

#### 7. Board and Committee Reports

#### 7.1 Board of Elders

- Elders working through the Book of Concord, Augsburg Confession. They will have a new leader/ presenter every 2 months.
- The Elders have decided we will be bringing the collection plate to the front to the altar as we did before Covid. We start after January 7th.

#### 7.2 Board of Trustees (Report by Tom)

- We have 3 trustees: Tom Edman, Travis Luepke and Dennis Smith. Also, Kerry Steffen is recognized. They were all noted as having done much and it is all much appreciated by all.
- Project updates by Tom: Members brought questions regarding the outside crosses in front and the bell tower regarding their finishes. On inspection, the paint is peeling but the crosses are in good shape. The goal is to repaint areas the first part of summer and before our Fall Anniversary.
- Landscaping: we thank Kerry for his work around the church placing foundation rocks and boulders. Maintenance is decreased with this.
- Courtyard: seed is re-established following heavy rains last summer. On one section, a land bridge will be taken care of for drainage. The elevation of the drain is designed to hold water.
- Fluorescent lights in the Parish Hall: There are 44 of the 4' bulbs, and we're looking to change to LED's. There are about 88 bulbs, taking out all the ballasts and changing to LED's. Ceiling lights in front of church were replaced. Bulbs might be changed there also to LED's and this will all be done starting in January.
- Also, Tom checked the Hillyard floor cleaning machine with the representative to review the machine as we are looking to use the machine more. With no janitorial service for 2024, we will have a janitorial signup sheet for volunteers to do the cleaning.
- Floors will be re-waxed and done before the Anniversary. We'll see how this volunteer process
- The parking lot is done with new asphalt coating and parking lines. This was done by Gallagher from Ortonville.

- A comment was made that we could use another Trustee as we have only three. Anyone interested, please contact Larry or one of the council members.
- Kerry stated we need more room for storage. Our white outside shed needs shingles. He suggests getting rid of it and raising money for a new garage/shed for the east side of the Parish Hall. With our crowded back room and furnace room, Carol mentioned electrical panels must have 20" around them for safety per the Fire Department. Currently, this is not the situation.
- There was a round of applause for Tom for his report and the Trustee work.

#### 7.3 Special committees

• Sue Erickson notes the 125th Anniversary plans are moving along.

Motion to approve these reports was made by Brad Christensen, 2nd by Ken Podratz, motion carried.

#### 8. Old Business

None noted or brought forward.

#### 9. New Business

- An audit committee is needed to review the books. Volunteers are Sue Erickson, Jayne Baumann, and Larry Cuklanz. This will be done in January.
- Election for treasurer 3 yr term. Anne's situation has changed, and she doesn't want to continue. Larry has some members in mind he'll speak with as no offers for the position were received at the meeting. We have no Vice Chairman either.
- Adopt 2024 Proposed Budget. Another question on the janitorial position and why it isn't on the budget. The plan is to do it ourselves. Anne is working on the chart for people to check off as they do work. "Outside Yardman" is now under "Snow Removal as we aren't paying for this work. Question on "Circuit Assessment" and Pastor mentioned that it is for the National Convention fee. The treasurer for the Circuit for the last 3 years didn't make an assessment so this year, we have three years' worth. It is noted we paid our assessment each year. We pay per our membership roster of 50 cents/year. Another reason to work on membership. A question on why we don't pay Kerry for his work in the church. Anne clarified we can't without filing a 1099 and he chooses not to be paid at this time. A suggestion was made to individually thank him as we wish. Motion was made to accept the 2024 budget by Brad Christensen, 2nd by Tammy Edman, motion carried.
