Pastor's Message

An ancient Hebrew fable goes like this:

Once there was a small leaf on an limb of a tall tree. The leaf was very content with its good life until it saw the birds flying above the forest. The leaf, then, yearned to be free like the birds, free to fly and experience many different things. The leaf struggled and struggled to be free. Then one morning, a strong gust of wind jerked the leaf from the limb and sent it sailing above the forest. It was free! It could now flit about as it pleased! How exhilarating it was for the leaf to see all the strange, new sights! It was great! Soon, however, the leaf began its journey downward and, eventually, it joined the other dead and dying leaves on the forest floor. There the sun's lethal rays struck the leaf. As the leaf withered and died, it cried out, "This is not freedom! This is not freedom! This is death!" Too late the leaf realized that freedom does not mean separation and complete independence. How wrong it was!

There are people and groups of people who think that only complete liberty with license to do anything one desires is freedom. They desire to do things as they please. This means freedom to not go to Sunday service or bible study if something else comes up. This means freedom to not serve in God's church because of old age or a busy life.

When this kind of freedom is applied to matters of faith and God, independence from God, His way, His will, His Word always marks the beginning of the journey downward. It cannot be otherwise.

As people of God, we know that the answer to real freedom is definitely not in doing our own thing. True and lasting freedom does not mean complete independence, but rather complete dependence on the Lord our God, having a heart that cries out, "Lord, what would you have me to do?" Only as we depend on God for His love, mercy, grace and strength, which He gives us through Christ Jesus, do we have freedom, especially the forgiveness of all our sins.

Only when we depend on the Lord God to provide us with spiritual food, His Word and Sacraments, do we have the strengthening of our faith in His Son our Savior who reminds us, "If you continue in My Word, then are you My disciples indeed, and you shall know the truth, and the truth shall set you free." John 8:31-32. Only as we depend on the Lord can we hope for that life which can never be separated from God, that life in Him.

Jesus continues in v. 36, "If the Son therefore shall make you free, you shall be free indeed." Oh yes, Christ Jesus frees us so that now we can live to Him, with Him and for Him. Have a blessed freedom day!

Refection from the past

Does anyone recognize what Lanny Hoyer is holding in this picture? Lanny designed and made a mold where he could reuse old church candles and melt them down and by using at least 3 small old candles, he now had a brandnew tall church candle for the candelabra! In the picture you can also see his old coffee pot that the



old candles were melted in on a small heating pad. The strainer was held on top of the form to strain out any particles of the old candles that still had wick left in them. Lanny recalls that the bees wax was probably the best type of wax to reuse as it didn't smoke like other candle wax.

The form that Lanny designed has 2 clamps on it and to open it you use a screwdriver at a designated area to open it. Lanny put a clamp on the top and bottom to hold the wick while the hot wax was being poured into the mold. The entire process took approximately 45 minutes to complete one candle. He poured the mold about 1/3 full and let it set and settle and then repeated that process two more times. Lanny remembers purchasing the wick at JoAnn Fabrics in Willmar.

Hats off to Lanny for designing a candle mold to reuse old church candles! Years later someone donated new candles that had oil in them and so we no longer buy candles. Lanny's candle mold will be on display at the 125th Anniversary celebration in one of the Sunday School rooms with other church memorabilia.

Convention Report

"Walking as Children of Light" was the theme for the Minnesota North District LWML Convention held at Cragun's Resort, Brainerd June 3-5. Mary Hammer and Judy Rode were among 250 attendees.

Worship services were held Monday evening and Wednesday morning. Bible Study was led by Rev. Dr. Lovejoy from Grand Rapids. President Kathy Brandt, and zone presidents carried the processional banners preceding the first convention meeting Tuesday morning. Business meetings were conducted to elect officers and determine the mission grants for the 2025-2027 biennium in the amount of \$147,000. The Keynote Speaker was Katie Schuermann, a nationally known author. Her latest book, "The Saints of Whistle Grove" was offered for sale. Contact Mary H or Judy R if you wish to read the book.

A Silent Auction was held to defray the convention expenses. Each society was asked to donate a basket for the auction. This fundraiser collected \$3,566 and The Mite Walk brought in \$4,136.

The ingathering items were donated to Relationship Safety Alliance (RSA), an organization in Fargo that supports people exposed to relationship abuse.

Three offerings were collected:

- #1. \$5,063.40 was gathered and applied towards the LWML Minnesota North District Mission Grant Goal.
- #2. \$4,428.60 went to Perry Center in Fargo to minister single women experiencing pregnancy.
- #3. \$4,232.08 was given to Lutheran Island Camp for financial aid to keep camp fees affordable.

The convention was a great time to make and renew friendship of LWML sisters. Ladies and young women, consider attending the National LWML Convention in Omaha in 2025. You will be blessed!
