# Pastor's Message

After this I looked, and behold, a great multitude that no one could number, from every nation, from all tribes and peoples and languages, standing before the throne and before the Lamb, clothed in white robes, with palm branches in their hands, and crying out with a loud voice, "Salvation belongs to our God who sits on the throne, and to the Lamb!" Revelation 7:9-10

As many advances as medical science has made, it still cannot prevent death from occurring. In 2017, an Indonesian man by the name of Sodimedjo died at the reported age of 146. Reportedly born in 1870, he had outlived four wives and all of his children. He had 12 grandchildren, 17 great grandchildren and two great-great grandchildren. The years passed and passed and passed, and it seemed like he might live forever. But alas! Death finally came to him too, as it does to all of us.

While we may be powerless to do anything about death, Jesus is not. The sole reason that our Lord Jesus Christ descended from His throne in heaven was to come down to earth and keep God's Law perfectly because He was without sin and then to offer His life as the perfect sacrifice on the altar of the cross for our place. The way that Jesus could give us life was by His own death.

All Saints Sunday, the first Sunday in November, is the date on which the Church celebrates the hope that we have that because Jesus died and rose again, all who die in faith will one day rise again in the resurrection on the last day. We have a hope that will not disappoint us, but a hope that sustains and strengthens us.

Many people are afraid of funerals, but not us. We are not afraid because we have something to say at funerals. Christ is risen! He is risen indeed! Alleluia! We have something to sing at funerals – I know that my redeemer lives.



# St. Paul Lutheran Church Quarterly Voter's Meeting Minutes September 15, 2024

(Covers period from June 23rd to present.)

- 1. Meeting called to order by Chairman DuWayne Galow. 32 in attendance.
- 2. Opening prayer by Pastor Varns
- 3. Minutes from June's meeting were reviewed. Motion to accept by Jim Wegner, 2nd by Dennis Smith. Motion passed.
- 4. Financial Report from Aug report: we have had more expenses than income and transferred \$9,500 so far, this entire year to pay our bills. Only \$4500 remains for this year of the Thrivent monies. Please prayerfully consider giving. Giving to requested donations is good, but also give to offerings so neither side is hurt in the budget. Question by Kerry: are we doing better by passing the offering plate? It was noted that more loose cash comes in than when the plate is left at the back of the church. It does swing in amount from week to week. Designated Projects: June through August.
  - Income from 125th Anniversary: We will be asking freewill donations for the meal.
  - Improvements, waxing and outside painting. We asked for \$11,000 and reached goal. Payment is made for painting. Trustees and Kerry did some outside painting.
  - Handbell expenses were lights and gloves.
  - Mixed choir was sheet music.
  - SAC, incoming money from free will donations and funeral income. Outgoing is Sunday morning donuts and supplies for coffee hour, plates, creamer, coffee, etc.
  - Sunday School rooms blinds on the south side were replaced. The blind fund was used and remaining amount from the general fund.
  - Water cooler supplies: more water purchased.
  - Don Hempel memorial was moved to accessible improvements.
  - Discussion on west entrance and if it would ever be done financially. Families will be contacted who donated to this.

Motion made to accept the financial reports by Jim Wegner, 2nd by Jim Rigge. Motion passed.

- Front building crosses, & bell tower has been painted, funded, and paid for.
- Completed the flooring waxing taking about a week. All stripped, reviewed by Trustees. Five coats of wax were done. Also, trustees and others moved things back and forth over the one week. Trustees and Dan Enninga doing the moving. Our tiles are original to the building of the church. Buffing will yet be done. We will be maintaining the floors ourselves with buffing.

• Kerry and Dan did the painting on south entrance. Also, black trim outside was done by Kerry. The east door, mechanical room and louvers are done. Painting white stucco around church will need to be done and volunteers are needed. Thanks to all who helped with the upkeep.

- MN North District Convention is February 23-25th, 2025 in Grand Rapids, MN. St. Paul gets 1 pastoral delegate and 1 lay delegate. A circuit forum will be announced soon. If you are interested in being a delegate, or if you are interested in submitting a nomination for district positions, or an overture to guide the mission of the district, please talk the pastor.
- There is a request for someone to set up and change banners and put up the funeral banner. Talk to Pastor if you are willing.
- There is a request for the Parish Hall tables to be taken down for Building Bridges Choir for the Thursday after the Anniversary. About 4 will go down and the rest will stay for the LWML Joy Shop October 6th.


