


Chi-Rho & CYF Mission Trip 2017

The Excellence in Ministry program seeks to reduce or alleviate some of the key financial pressures that inhibit effective pastoral leadership, and improve the financial literacy and management skills of pastoral leaders through education (increasing their ability to provide capable leadership for congregations and ministries under their care).

Among other benefits, this program has the potential to:

Help pastors remain in and be more effective in ministry over a longer period of time

Benefit congregations by having more effective leadership and less turnover

Benefit the church by having pastoral leaders who are more engaged

Enhance the relationship between seminaries, seminary houses and foundations, and the church

Enhance long-term participation in Pension Fund programs

I am honored to be able to be a part of this new vitally important program. This past weekend, October 21-22, I attended a two-day Financial Literacy program as the first educational component. The first day my husband, Andrew, and I spent the day reflecting on our financial health (financial identity, budgeting, clergy taxes, investment and retirement planning). The second day Board Chair Judy Grasham and congregational leader Emily Henderson joined me for a day of learning about congregational finances (congregation as employer, resourcing mission, best financial practices). We all found the conference to be worthwhile.

My participation in this program will continue over the next three years through continued educational events, mentor and small group meetings, and the gift of grant money to assist with student loan debt. In recognition that we are all stewards of the gifts that God has entrusted us with, I pray that this program will assist in our growth as faithful and generous managers of God's blessings.
