MOMENT'S REFLECTION

"The whole assembly kept silence, and listened to Barnabas and Paul as they told of all the signs and wonders that God had done through them among the Gentiles." -Acts 15:12

I wish I could have met him, picked his brain a little. Leon Megginson was 88 years old when he passed



away February 2010 at his home in Mobile, Alabama. He was a decorated WWII Air Force veteran who served as a pilot with the Eighth Air Force in England.

Following the war, Leon enrolled in Mississippi College where he received his bachelor's degree in 1947. He then entered Louisiana State University's graduate program in Business Administration, received his MBA in 1949, and earned his Ph.D. in Management in 1953.

Megginson went on to become a full professor of Social Sciences at LSU, publishing some 100 articles and winning numerous awards for teaching and research, while also authoring or coauthoring over 40 editions of 18 textbooks. I'm most intrigued by a

comment he made at a 1963 Southwestern Social Science Association. Reflecting on how to survive in a changing culture, Megginson said:

"Change is the basic law of nature. But the changes wrought by the passage of time affects individuals and institutions in different ways . . . It's not the most intellectual of the species that survives; it is not the strongest that survives . . . It's the one that is able best to adapt and adjust to the changing environment in which it finds itself."

Megginson was reflecting on Charles Darwin's theory of species survival, but he was using that theory to talk about the need for American business to remain flexible in changing times. To be successful a business needed to cultivate the art of adaptability. Rigidity in the face of change, he warned, would lead to business failure and steady decline.

I ponder the wisdom of Megginson's insight as I meditate on that scene in the Book of Acts. Our Church forbearers were trying to deal with a changing Church culture. When Jesus said, "Go into all the world and make disciples" they mistakenly thought he meant: "Go into the all the world and make disciples . . . of good Jews like us." To their surprise, they began to learn that the Church's continued vitality depended on its capacity to adapt to a new reality that Gentiles, not only Jews, had a place in the Church, too.

Here at the beginning of a new year; here on the eve of a presidential inauguration; here, especially, in a world social context that doesn't feel anything like the kind of church-friendly culture I grew up in small town America back in the 1960's, I recall Megginson's profound insight and pray to God that I'll learn faithful ways to be the kind of pastor who can gracefully adapt to change. **-Dan**

We are in need of additional volunteers if our church is going to continue our ministry to the community in which we live! We deliver meals to homebound individuals every Monday. Each volunteer only delivers one day a month with a time commitment of approximately 2 hours. <u>We currently need volunteers</u> (one or two people) to deliver the fourth Monday of each month. Our route is easy to learn (maps are provided) and training will be provided the first time you deliver (one of our experienced volunteers will go with you). Coolers containing the meals for each route are delivered to First Presbyterian Church, located around the corner from our church, by 10:15am each day. Routes

consist of one cooler filled with hot meals and one cooler containing cold items. After delivery of our route the empty coolers are returned to First Presbyterian for pickup.

Delivering meals through the **Meals on Wheels** program is one of the outreach ministries in which our church is involved. This is a program set up to provide a hot, nutritious midday meal to those individuals unable to prepare a meal for themselves. The people who receive this benefit are appreciative of the care and time given to them. For some, this is the only source of food they eat daily. We would like to continue our support of this worthwhile program by providing volunteers to cover a route each Monday.
