Moment's Reflection

"And remember, I am with you always" -Matthew 28:20

I have some advice for this year's graduating seniors.



I've accumulated a lot of degrees in my life, but I didn't learn what I want to tell you in a classroom. I learned it by living and taking time to reflect on the life I've lived. While I don't discount the extraordinary value of formal learning, most of what I know to be true about life has come to me by way of prayerful reflection.

Five words of counsel, I give to you.

One, this is just the beginning! I know your graduation will be all about what you've accomplished. About endings, and goodbyes. But this is a season of commencement in your life. It's good to take time to celebrate accomplishments. It's even better to look forward to what is yet to come. So, cherish the past, learn how to be in the moment. But always and ever look forward.

Two, plans change, and that's a good thing! It's good to be certain about what you want to do. Without such determination, you might

never have the courage to take the next step. But along the way, the plans you thought were cast in stone almost always change. Don't be afraid of that. This is what make's life so serendipitously wonderful. You begin with one idea in mind. Along the way, you discover new paths and these new paths, ones you could never have imagined, are almost always richer than the ones with which you began.

Three, you'll receive everything you need, but not all of what you want. Praise God for this blessing. The satisfaction of your needs is what will give you joy. Selfish insistence for those things you want will almost always lead to trouble. The truth is, God knows you're not wise enough (ever!) to tell the difference between your needs and wants. God gives you what you need.

Four, wonderful things will happen to you, and you probably won't know it when they do. What I value most—the people, the places, the moments—happened while I was busy looking at something else. It's only in looking back, in taking stock of where I've been, that I've appreciated how rich my life has been.

Five, God has his hand in everything. You may be tempted to forget that. In your moments of selfimportance, you may be fooled in believing that your accomplishments are the result of how smart or capable you are. You may even think that you've been extraordinarily lucky. But the meaning of your life will never only be the product of either great talent or extraordinarily luck. It will always be a work of God—the silent, unseen weaver of goodness who orchestrates the moments of your life.
