Personal Story

I was the oldest of 3 children, born July 29, 1928 in Rockwall, Texas. I lived on my grandparents' farm for the first part of my life. Then we moved to Dallas. We were all born in our parents' home. We moved often, first living in Italy, Texas for my dad's work at Texas Fish Hatcheries. We moved to Jasper, San Angelo, then to Wichita Falls. I was 16 when I graduated from high school and moved out of my parents' home. I graduated from North Texas Agriculture College and worked at Southwestern Bell in downtown Dallas in the



directory office. Soon afterwards I met my husband, William Davenport after a friend introduced us. We met in May, 1947 and married in November, 1947. We lived in Dallas until 1952 when we had our first and only child, Gary Wayne Davenport. We moved to Garland in 1952. My husband began working for Motor Rebuilders and I went back to work part-time. My son was in the 5th grade when I went to work for Liberty Mutual as a secretary in the Policy department. William went to work for Safeway in the warehouse, where he retired from. I still have fond memories of every July taking our family vacations to Colorado or Arkansas, where we spent our time relaxing in cabins on the lake.

Church Activities

We joined FCCG in 1952. I had previously belonged to a Methodist Church in Oak Cliff and my husband was a Church of Christ member. A friend asked us to visit FCCG. After a year of attending services, we joined as a family. Our family was baptized together by Pastor Ed Mace. William, known as Willy, was a Deacon and did many visitations. He sat overnight many times at Williams Funeral Home with deceased church members. I was active in Disciples Women's, which I enjoyed very much. Every year we

had a Mother/Daughter banquet that I enjoyed being asked to sing for. I also sang Soprano in the choir and played violin at many services. My husband and I worked in the youth program with the middle-aged school group every Sunday night.

Present

I have a beautiful granddaughter named Christina, who has been a great joy in my life. She came into my life just 6 months after my husband died. Christina will be leaving in 2 weeks for the University of Missouri. My hope for the future is to have better health and be able to interact more with Life. Somedays can be a struggle, because I miss my church friends. I have not been able to drive for the past year and I miss the freedom of being able to come and go to church. I very much enjoy any contact I have with the church members, and I especially miss my Ruth Mix class.

Dear Church Member,

This year, First Christian Church Garland will be celebrating its 143rd anniversary. As it is with many things that endure the test of time, there is great beauty to protect and preserve, along with a host of things to replace, repair or refurbish. Over the past several months, great strides have been made to beautify the church, both inside and out, due in large part to the time, talent and generosity of church members. However, there are still areas needing critical attention. To this end, we are apprising you of those needs in the form of a **Wish List Campaign**. If you would like to contribute to the following projects, any and all donations will be appreciated.

The most URGENT needs are:

Air Conditioning: We need to replace older units with new units rather than continuing to make costly repairs.

Roof: We are investigating the possibility of installing a pitched roof over the existing flat roof to prevent leaks caused by standing water.

Fire Detection & Safety: It is imperative the church has the appropriate fire detection and safety equipment and can pass fire code.

Less urgent needs are:

Flooring: The carpet along the 2nd floor and the 1st floor (north side of the Sanctuary) hallways as well as in Room 201 and the Robe Rooms needs to be replaced.



New Pew Cushions: Many of the 71 pew cushions are worn and have become stained over the years.

Update to the Youth Wing: The furniture and décor in the Youth Wing is in need of a serious facelift to attract young members.
