Moment's Reflection



For years I've begun sermons by praying the words of the Psalmist: "Lord, let the words of my mouth and the meditation of my heart be acceptable to you." (Psalm 19:14). The prayer suggests an important connection between the issues of my heart, what broods deep within, and the words I speak.

In discussion with some religious leaders of his day, Jesus says as much, teaching that one's mouth plays a critical role in whether one is justified or condemned (Matthew 12:37). James, in his typically sober way, suggests that words carry social-ethical importance. Once words leave our

mouths, they impact the community to whom they're spoken. He writes: "How great a forest is set ablaze by a small fire. And the tongue is a fire." (James 3:5-6).

In all the New Testament emphasizes the urgency of measuring our words—that we speak them with great care, resist the impulse to blurt them out thoughtlessly.

The good news is that the same words which have power to wreak destruction may also evoke life and blessing. Last Sunday I talked about the power of words to disclose spiritual health. Over the next 5 weeks, I want to think about specific uses of words:

Here is an update on the church's Wish List of items to be repaired or replaced. We've made some very good progress

MOST URGENT NEEDS:

Air Conditioning: We have replaced 3 of the 7 units that needed repairs.

Roof: We are investigating the possibility of installing a pitched roof over the existing flat roof to prevent leaks caused by standing water.

Fire Detection & Safety: It is imperative the church has the appropriate fire detection and safety equipment and can pass fire code. (COMPLETED)



LESS URGENT NEEDS:

Flooring: The carpet along the 2nd floor and the 1st floor (north side of the Sanctuary) hallways as well as in Room 201 (COMPLETED) and the Robe Rooms needs to be replaced.

New Pew Cushions: Many of the 71 pew cushions are worn and have become stained over the years.

Update to the Youth Wing: The furniture and décor in the Youth Wing is in need of a serious facelift to attract young members.
