MOMENT'S REFLECTION

Fra Angelico, the early Renaissance artist, paints one of the most indelible images we have of the emotion, and scope of All Saints. In the painting (c. 1423), entitled simply, "The Forerunners of Christ with Saints and Martyrs," Angelico imagines a scene from heaven. In the words of the hymn, we catch a glimpse of "all the saints adoring Thee." As lovely as Angelico's work is, the painting obscures the deeper significance of any Christian celebration of All Saints. As St. John of the Book of Revelation imagines, heaven is not an abode for the "saintly." It is for all who have believed in Jesus and kept the faith.



Some Christians, of course, seem to rise above the rest of us. They live particularly virtuous, magnanimous lives. Perhaps, as Angelico imagines, they really do strut the courts of heaven, with their heads encased in golden halos, their hands held in postures of prayer, now dressed in the garments of profound spirituality. They lived their lives so well, so graciously, so generously, that we really do adore them, remember them above all others.

But not all the saints of heaven lived such saintly lives, not even most of them. In fact, Scripture teaches that most saints are remarkable for their ordinariness. They are saints with dirt beneath their fingernails, backs hunched for having spent a life doing physical labor, their faces creased with worry, their records marked with times of obvious weakness. They have walked switch-back paths of faith. But they are saints, too.

The word "saint" comes from the Greek word "hagios"—a word that means not uncommon greatness, but the quality of a person who has given oneself to holy purposes, not perfectly, but as best one knows how. Such persons are holy not as Angelico imagines, but because God in God's great love and grace and mercy has understood the genuineness of their hearts and counted them as holy ones.

This **All Saints, Sunday, November 4th**, please join me in remembering the great ones who have graduated from this life to the next. But then remember and celebrate the ordinary saints among us, too: those who live humble, quiet, lives of faithful resolve—who make not giant leaps, but a life of successive small steps. And then remember that you are one such saint of God, too. Be encouraged that faithfulness, not greatness, is what draws us to heaven. —Dan

Carroll & Terry Barnes

Carroll Barnes was born in Abilene, Texas and Terry Barnes was born in Canyon City, Colorado.

Carroll had an interesting experience his first day of school in 1st grade that started off his teaching career. (Next time you see him, ask him to tell you the story)

Carroll graduated from North Texas in 1963

with a major in Music Education and a minor in English. Carroll began his career as a music teacher at the elementary level in Ballinger, Texas. Terry's younger brother and sister were his students.

Terry and Carroll met in February of 1965 and in September 1965, Carroll took Terry to Commerce, Texas to perform in the All Senior Honor Choir 3-day competition. After Terry graduated, she worked in the high school library before going to beauty school. Carroll was then teaching in the high school. After dating for 8 months, they were married.


Carroll taught music at Perryton, TX and taught junior high for 5 years before moving to Lubbock. In July of 1974, he started teaching at South Garland HS and taught from 1974-1982. In 1975, the South Garland High School Show Boaters became exceptionally good after Carroll purchased sound equipment for them. In 1982-1997, Carroll was the director of fine arts for the GISD. In 1974-1975, Carroll also taught choir at Valwood Methodist Church.

In 1976, Carroll became the director of FCCG Chancel choir. Carroll left FCCG for a time, but when he returned he would stand in for Stan McGill whenever he was called upon.

Many people at FCCG do not know that Carroll would go early on Wednesday nights to clean up after the pigeons roosting on the front porch of the church. This kept our church entrance clean for everyone.

For several years, Carroll drove the church bus on many trips. He was responsible for driving 22 passengers on a trip to Luckenbach on one particular occasion. A great time was had by all. For many years, Carroll drove the youth to and from camps and took care of the vehicles.

Many do not know that Carroll and Terry rode motorcycles with the Gold Wing Road Riders Association. Carroll was the state director for 2 years, assistant for 2 years, and state treasurer for 4 years. Carroll has ridden in 48 states, plus the provinces of Canada and half of Mexico.
