# **MOMENT'S REFLECTION**

"And now I commend you to God and to the message of his grace."

-Acts 20:32 (Paul, in a farewell address to the Elders in Ephesus)

Ministry calls for such an extraordinary kind of relationship between pastor and people.

Pastors are both set apart and called to live alongside the people to whom they serve. Pastors are loved as friends, but reminded to be prophets in residence. Pastors are called to live in emotional solidarity with congregants, yet also called, even expected, to stand above the fray of human living. Pastors are called to be faithfully transparent in all matters while also called weekly to hear, carry and protect deep confidences. But perhaps most confusing, pastors are also sometimes called to say farewell to those whom they love deeply.

Some say a Pastor and people share a sort of covenantal marriage bond. Pastor and people are abidingly faithful to one another. As in marriage, pastor and people have and hold dear one another, in times of prosperity and poverty, in times of sickness and health.

And yet, unlike the covenantal marriage vow we don't insist that the pastor make a life-time commitment to a congregation. We can't, not because our hearts sometimes want anything less,



but because it's the nature of Christ's ministry that pastors receive new calls, in new places.

And so, with understandable emotional reservation we come to **Sunday**, **December 20**. After nearly 14 years of ministry with us as our beloved Associate Minister, Ray will formally retire during morning worship. With his retirement the nature of our relationship with him changes. Likewise, the nature of Ray's relationship with us changes.

Do we remain friends? Of course. Do we continue to care for and remember one another in our prayers? Of course. Will we worship together again? In time, I suspect we will. But with Ray's retirement some things change.

How, then, does the church relate to Ray in the weeks and months to come? In a document entitled **Covenant of Closure** provided to Disciples clergy from our denomination's General Office—a document which Ray and Larry Ross have discussed and accepted—the denomination strongly encourages certain relationship expectations between a minister and one's former charge. In summarizing the essence of this new relationship, Area Minister, Larry Ross, offers the following three specific ways that we can help Ray keep those expectations:

1. "Respect Ray's need to be away from participation in our congregation for about six months. Please do not ask him to do pastoral calls, hospital calls, counseling, weddings or funerals of former parishioners, or to take any responsibilities until the end of next summer. Churches worldwide have found that such a period of being away is required so that the minister actually enters restful retirement, rather than reverting to being an unpaid extra staff member.

2. Understand that Ray will refrain from discussing problems he may see in this congregation with anyone other than his Area Minister, and will rely on the Area Minister if differences arise to resolve them.

3. At the end of six months Ray may choose to re-enter congregational life as a church member and participant. Please do not assume he will begin doing unpaid ministry functions. Ray has earned his retirement leisure!"

At first glance, these expectations may seem unnatural, even perhaps unnecessary to some of you. But please understand.

Just as the terms of the **Covenant of Closure** helps Ray lean successfully into retirement, the Covenant also helps us successfully move forward. As Ray's most recent charge, we have an important need to grieve and ultimately accept the end of one chapter of ministry in order to begin focusing on a new emerging chapter. To this end, the Covenant of Closure encourages some of the following:

1. Loving Ray and Laurie, and his family, and continuing to keep open the bonds of friendship, but permitting him the freedom to retire while also releasing him to new forms of ministry.

2. Maintaining great hope that with Christ alive in our Church, every ending is an interim period (a "Holy Saturday," as Joyce Rupp puts it) during which Christ prepares us for what's to come.

3. Giving both Pastors Allison and Casey your confidence that having been called to Christian Ministry and variously gifted, they, like Ray (like me), are able to serve our church's pastoral needs in the years to come, and that we, the people, are ready to begin loving them as we have, and will continue, to love Ray. **–Dan, Advent 2015**

# **VOLUNTEERS NEEDED FOR MEALS ON WHEELS**

We are in need of additional volunteers if our church is going to continue our ministry to the community in which we live! We deliver meals to homebound individuals every Monday. Each volunteer only delivers one day a month with a time commitment of approximately 2 hours. We currently need volunteers (one or two people) to deliver the second Monday of each month, and volunteers (one or two people) to deliver meals the third Monday of each month. Our route is easy to learn (maps are provided) and training



will be provided the first time you deliver (one of our experienced volunteers will go with you). Coolers containing the meals for each route are delivered to First Presbyterian Church, located around the corner from our church, by 10:15am each day. Routes consist of one cooler filled with hot meals and one cooler containing cold items. After delivery of our route the empty coolers are returned to First Presbyterian for pickup.

Delivering meals through the Meals on Wheels program is one of the outreach ministries in which our church is involved. This is a program set up to provide a hot, nutritious midday meal to those individuals unable to prepare a meal for themselves. The people who receive this benefit are appreciative of the care and time given to them. For some, this is the only source of food they eat daily. We would like to continue our support of this worthwhile program by providing volunteers to cover a route each Monday.


