CHURCH COVENANT (to be read on first Sunday in lieu of Mission & Vision Statement)

Senior Pastor talks about the Vision Center Progress

"Dreams occur in our sleep. Visions occur while you are wide awake." Let's roll out.

This is your update on the Vision Center, as concise as I can make it for all of us:

- 1. **Request:** Prayer on Land! This will take place each Sunday following worship beginning on Sunday, April 3. Usually 3-5 minutes, once we make our circle. **Update:** Prayer walks on the land after church each Sunday was re-established by Bro. Stefanov and he has been consistent. He invites me and others to share in this ministry of prayer to conquer the land following Church on Sunday. Thank you Bro. Stefanov. Deacon Dove invites you to join him or lead out on Saturdays following the 7-8 AM prayer.
- 2. Review and send out update notices. Pledgees need to know about their pledge balances due and/or if they are paid in full before we begin the next fund raising campaign. Update: Our treasurer has identified a financial system that I believe will be able to address some of our immediate and long term financial notifications being requested by leadership and membership. Let me set a suspense date of November 1 to get an update for us.
- 3. **Identify new Vision Center team members.** We are requesting that any member of St. Paul interested in volunteering their time, talents, and treasury, in the day to

day efforts of communicating the vision and constructing the center simultaneously—You are welcome to call the office to join the team. We need you! **Update:** We have had 1 new volunteer and 3 inquiry from existing KBM (Kingdom Building Ministry) members about what will the committee be doing different at this point than previous. Answer: Developing system to track contributions for KBM; scheduling congregation updates from existing construction professionals and architects in completing a phase of the project to get construction started; update members on city permit costs, etc., and the current status and timeframe available for the Baptist Builders to recommit and come assist SPMBC with construction.

4. **Prepare to build the Lobby portion. Update:** This portion of the phase of the Vision Center must be reevaluated for current cost and item #3 will provide the estimated start date for this phase. We've missed the last two projected dates. Watch God Provide! We are 3 years behind on the original date, or are we? Watch God Provide!

<u>Vision Center Updates</u> will be provided on a monthly basis. The same information in greater detail may be shared in our Church Business Meetings. Our next opportunity for that is Saturday, October 28 at 5 PM.

Vision Center (VC) Description—The VC will be located at 333 N. Carmichael Ave, Sierra Vista, AZ and is a community based multi-purpose facility that will provide activities and mentorship to children, youth, young & senior adults of the community particularly in the economically challenged West-End.

Our Few Housekeeping & Church Etiquette things for our visitors, and reminders for our members:

In respect to the House of God, our Senior Pastor request that there be







2 Peter 3:4

"They will say, "What happened to the promise that Jesus is coming again? From before the times of our ancestors, everything has remained the same since the world was first created."

What happens when tragedy occurs in the magnitude that we are witnessing these days? In our lifetime! What happens when time seems to sit still for no one yet time seems for ever for every one involved in the tragic situations happening in our beloved United States of America and Abroad? What happens when we pray to God and the answer is another violent situation or outcome before we get to deal with the last one? Anybody else asks these questions but me?
