

CHURCH COVENANT

Attention: All Leaders, Members, & Worshippers of St. Paul:

It's not an April Fool's Day joking matter – COVID – 19. It's still with us and we are still in the fight to WIN! Our Nation, Our Church, Our Community, Our People. We have been dealing with this horrific virus since December 2019 and still have the Hope of Christ that it all works out for our good according to Romans 8:28.

Praise be unto God! Although the journey has been different, devilish, and dangerous at times, we are determined to be VICTORIOUS! On Tuesday, March 17, following our Tuesday evening Bible Study, I announced some unprecedented changes to our lifestyle of Worship and Christian Education that productively led to our Church aligning our goals with the rest of the World, to eliminate COVID-19. We've been doing our part as a Christian member of the Body of Christ and an example of the Care & Compassion Jesus demonstrated to those in need – Saved and Unsaved!

I want to take this opportunity to say a special "Thank You" to the men, women, and children of St. Paul, for your under-standing, cooperation, and compassion to our neighbors, employers, families, and one another. And lest I forget, the most important factor of all, your prayers. Your prayers, coupled with those of the rest of the body of Christ, have given our Nation and World a spiritual boost, like never seen in most of our lifetimes.

I have tried to provide you with "prepare, don't panic." I wanted to remind all of us about the word taught by the Apostle Paul to Timothy, in 2 Timothy 1:7, "7 For God has not given us a spirit of fear and timidity, but of power, love, and self-discipline." (NLT) and "7 For God hath not given us the spirit of fear; but of power, and of love, and of a sound mind." How comforting to know God already knew situations like the COIVD-19 and many other things would come through our neighborhood and cause a disruption from our normal day, but it would not be able to stop us from functioning, if we did not give into fear. "Fear not, for I have overcome the world." – John 16:33

In order to adapt to the prayerfully temporary season in America, we must address our need to watch and pray – Matthew 26:41. This scripture alludes to the fact that temptation will come to challenge our Spirit, while our flesh is weak, however; our goal is to be over comers and not give into the flesh. How can this be accomplished during this season? I have a few things I want you to be prepared for when you arrive at church this Sunday for the 8:45 AM Sunday School and the 10:00 AM Worship Service. - 3. Use the Givelify app through our website at www.spmbcsv.com to "bring your tithes and offering to the storehouse," Malachi 3:10. Yes, it's different but it works!
- 4. Wherever possible, feel free to put one chair in between you and the next person at any church gathering, including music rehearsals, ministry meetings, etc.
- 5. Help us help you and your family feel safe, be safe, and still be able to function to the best of our ability during this season. Feel free to offer any other suggestion that will help us provide the safest and healthiest ministry worship experience for our members Afresh!
- 6. I feel like the children of Israel during the plagues. It was inconvenient, for a specific time, and God would get the glory! We are expecting the same. Thanks for your cooperation and understanding. See you sooner than later.

Hospital allowing visitors now. Here are the rules for visiting at the hospital:

2 visitors per patient are allowed on the floors
1 visitor may accompany patients in the ED
Visitors must be 16 years of age or older
Visitors must wear masks at all times while in the hospital
Visitors may use waiting rooms as long as socially distancing
of 6 feet or greater can be maintained
All visitors must be screened prior to entering
Visiting hours will be from 0800-1800
Visitors will not be allowed for COVID-positive
or COVID-rule out patients
Visitors will not be allowed in the cafeteria at this time



We, Pastors and Faith-leaders of Sierra Vista and the surrounding area, want to express our condemnation of racism in all its forms.

The Christian faith is not silent on the subject of racism. In fact, the very first chapters of the Bible are foundational to the Christian understanding of human dignity.

"So God created man in his own image; he created him in the image of God; he created them male and female." Gen 1:27. With this foundation, we can fully ascribe value to every human being. Theologians call this topic the image Dei, the image of God. This image is like a reflection, a mirror if you will, reflecting God. Every human is made according to the image of God. As a result of this, every human has value, regardless of skin color, social or economic status. That is why Scripture expresses strong condemnation against racism.

The imago Dei proved instrumental in the civil rights movement of a previous generation. Historian Richard Wills provides evidence for this in his book, Martin Luther King, Jr. and the Image of God, when he says, "Martin Luther King Jr.'s use of Imago Dei language existed on the edge of a historical dialogue and quest for human civil rights..." Wills says that King's understanding that humans are created in the Image of God and endowed with intrinsic worth was his "primary appeal for civil rights."

Martin Luther King, Jr. famously said, 'There are no gradations in the image of God. Every man from a treble white to a bass black is significant on God's keyboard, precisely because every man is made in the image of God.' We have an obligation to not stand silent when we see others abuse other image-bearers. In fact, we are called to do the opposite of silence, we are called to act. We are called to action in proclaiming the dignity of humankind. The sin of partiality or favoritism (James 2:9) is alive in many hearts today. "I give you a new command: Love one another. Just as I have loved you, you are also to love one another." (John 13:34). We are commanded to love, love God, and love our neighbor. Love is more than mere words. It is also action. We who sign this are committed to loving in both word and deed (1 John 1:18).

This sacrificial love was the driving force of Jesus' life and ministry, and it still is today. Without it, we will never accomplish the work of reconciliation. We simply cannot do it without understanding that His love compels us to love our enemies. There's an African proverb that we think expresses beautifully just how important this face-to-face kind of friendship is: "When I saw you from afar, I thought you were a monster. When you got closer, I thought you were just an animal. When you got even closer, I saw that you were a human, but when we were face to face I realized that you were my brother." (Perkins, John M.. One Blood (p. 165). Moody Publishers.)

Now, more than ever, is the time to draw close. Join us in drawing close.


