

#### **Buildings & Grounds**



Even from the earliest history of this church, CAPC has proven over and over again that wars, or economic downturns or other challenges never keep this church down...and now we can add pandemic to that list as well. This past year we have made major strides in the continued renovation of the church campus. Through a grant that funded the majority of the project, the First Place parking lot was remediated, repaved and relined. This represented a wonderful improvement to our campus. The work is not yet completed as we will be repairing/restoring fencing to the front and are continuing to investigate improving lighting in the back area. Donations have already been received to help begin this project.

In addition, we have installed a new walkway to the parking lot as well. This was funded largely from a grant from the Northeast Presbytery (the shortfall of \$1K to be taken from special projects). The garage roof was repaired and cleaned out and now serves as a distribution point for the clothing, housewares and other items donated to help support the community.

Other items accomplished on our to-do list included the repair and care of our Sanctuary and Chapel doors, steps renovated to the Sanctuary and Chapel and quotes to help reset the stones in our walkways leading up to the church.

The care of a campus this side is no small task. We are blessed with Elders Nicholas Stevens and Henry Ward who work tirelessly to help make all of this happen. In addition, the donations received by you are critical to helping us restore this church to its grandeur.

We will not falter in our faith, nor lag in our zeal to continue the work necessary to ensure we offer the best we have to God and His glory, and provide a building that is a testament to our desire to build up God's Kingdom and provide a sanctuary and space for people to

gather, for lives to be transformed and for glory to be given to God.

### **CAPC Archive Project**



1890 Winter Scene




#### Valarie's Soup Kitchen (VSK)

I couldn't imagine missing the opportunity to program this in our Lessons and Carols and Christmas Eve services, so you will have TWO opportunities to hear the choir sing it before the year is over.

Dr. Sessomes joined the Department in 2004, as the Assistant Director for the Office of Transitional Services. She has since climbed the ranks, holding titles of Director and Assistant Commissioner in the Division of Programs, responsible for overseeing educational, transitional and religious services, residential community reintegration programs (RCRP), community engagement and reentry initiative (CERI), victim and volunteer services. She has been instrumental in spearheading the NJLEAD grants, establishing the CERI Unit and expanding the rehabilitative services available to the incarcerated population. In addition, Dr. Sessomes has launched trauma, recovery and resiliency for the women at Edna Mahan Correctional Facility and heads the critical incident stress management (CISM) team.

Dr. Sessomes received a Doctorate of Social Work from the University of Pennsylvania, School of Policy and Practice. Additionally, she received both a Bachelor of Arts in Sociology and a Master of Social Work from Rutgers University. Most recently, she completed her Master of Divinity at Princeton Theology Seminary. Dr. Sessomes is a Licensed Clinical Social Worker in New Jersey and Pennsylvania. She has served as a part-time lecturer for Rutgers University School of Social Work, the University of Pennsylvania, Montclair University and Kean University.
