and Christ, our Lord, by heaven adored, is mighty now to save.*

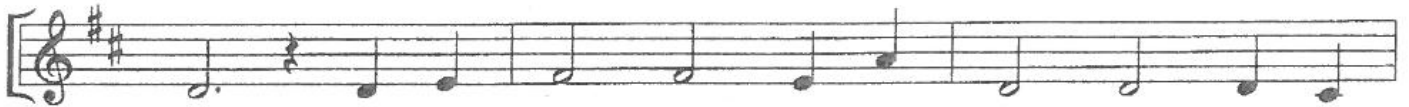

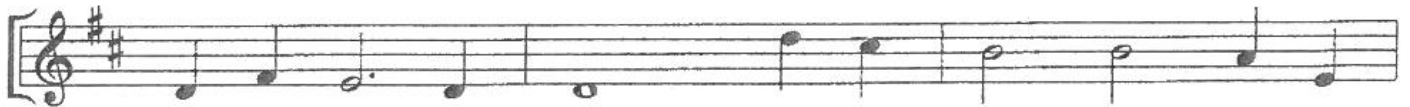
