The Hudson Family

"Truly we do not know what we would have done or the calamity that would be upon us if we had not received the grants that we did. Beginning the adoption process for a second time in our lives was a surprise for us as we surrendered to God's calling. Financially, we were totally unprepared. Moving forward to adopt TWO children at once, both with special needs, would not only mean we were providing for five children now, but increasing medical expenditures as well. During our adoption process, we experienced the rockiest employment road we have ever been on. A medical condition caused a change in jobs for Jon and a major change in our income. Shortly after, his new company lost its biggest client, and as the newest hire, Jon lost his job. Day-to-day expenses, along with the \$48,000 plus in adoption costs, seemed insurmountable. God worked through and destroyed the obstacles, making it appear effortless!

And as for the new bundles of kiddo? They are doing fabulous! We thank God for blessing us with them, and the responsibility of caring for them. We often reflect on how very much we would be missing had we let either of their special needs (or any of our selfish objections) stand in the way of adopting them. Thirteen months, twelve fundraisers, over 150 pages of documents completed, signing our names individually more than 60 times each, twenty-one total grant applications, seven plane rides and over 14,000 miles - and they were worth EVERY BIT OF IT! It has been a journey of faith and an awesome display of God's power. Thank you, SowingRoots, for caring enough when God stirred your hearts to start this organization. Thank you for the countless hours you spend pouring over applications and making tough decisions. Thank you for advocating for the fatherless. You are forever part of our family's story, names written on our hearts as those who fight for the fatherless. Stories of orphans and the fatherless took on an entirely new meaning for me one conversation-filled evening in August 2008. I was getting to know the man who would one day become my husband and his story hit a chord in my heart - one so hard for me to fathom as a self-proclaimed daddy's girl. My husband has never met his father and I can tell you first hand the impact that's had on him his entire life. Soon after I met Casey, God put something else on my heart - the call to become a missionary in Guatemala. The summer of 2009 changed my life.

In June 2009 that tender, fatherless man, asked me to be his wife. Just a week later I left on my first short-term mission trip to Guatemala. (I'm thinking his proposal timing was less than coincidental.) I had prayed and day-dreamed in the months leading up to and preparing for the trip but nothing could have prepared me for the incredible things I would become forever aware of in those 11 days. Let me tell you - Guatemalan children are some of the most beautiful things in all of God's creation. Those eyes! Oh those deep brown eyes that stare right into your soul! I learned about the 55% + unemployment rates of rural Guatemala, of the realities of poverty at a level I had never seen before, of the vast number of widows raising children whose fathers were absent for reasons of premature death and in some cases complete abandonment.

I was reminded of the Psalmist's words: "Father of the fatherless, defender of widows - this is God, whose dwelling is holy." (Psalm 68:5 NLT) These children and widows had not been abandoned, for God so loved them that He sent them help - and even allowed me to be His hands and feet to serve these families. The lens for which I viewed the widow and orphan epidemic in the world crystallized, and my role, as defined by God, in helping them became much more clear.

It's now 5 years later and God's prompting in me to love orphans and widows only grows stronger. I returned from my 5th trip to Guatemala a few weeks ago. I'm officially addicted to missionary work. Best yet - that fatherless man who slyly asked me to be his bride right before my first trip - came with me this year. He even got to share his story of how God became his Father when his earthly father had abandoned him with a group of 78 teenagers at a middle school in the village of Cerro de Oro. The teenage boys especially hung on his every word.

The mission of SowingRoots to bring together forever families and fight the orphan epidemic in the world is aspirational, inspiring, overwhelming, and altogether completely captivating. I'm incredibly grateful to be just a small part of their efforts through monthly donations. After all - we're really just stewards of the resources that belong to God anyhow. For in the words of Jesus, "Come, who are blessed by my Father...For I was hungry and you gave me something to eat, I was thirsty and you gave me something to drink, I was a stranger and you invited me in, I needed clothes and you clothed me, I was sick and you looked after me...Truly I tell you, whatever you did for one of the least of these brothers and sisters of mine, you did for me."(Matthew 25:34-40 NKJV)

Grant updates

Second quarter 2014

We received 25 grant applications for our July 1st review. SowingRoots awarded 8 families with grants for a total of \$8,000. These 8 families represent 9 children ranging in age from newborn to 4 years. 5 of these children have special needs and will soon hopefully be in the U.S. to receive help from specialists. Children will be coming home to their forever families from China, Uganda, Ethiopia, as well as the U.S.
