Trustee Albert and Vernice Smith Scholarship Criteria

The Smith family would like to honor their parents by providing financial aid to deserving students who are graduating from high school. The candidate must be a member of First Rising Mt. Zion Baptist Church for one or more years at the time of application. The Smith family's parents loved children, and Sister Vernice Smith worked with children at a daycare for many years.

Duration of the award: The Albert and Vernice Smith Scholarship will make an award to one or more eligible students for a total of 4 years. The high school student must be a church member in good standing. The award is based on the number of students who are eligible to apply for the scholarship not to exceed \$1,000.00 annually (e.g., yearly funding \$0,000.00 / the number of eligible students = \$0,000.00 award for the year). Prior year funds awarded shall not be construed as a guarantee of funding in subsequent years.

The criteria used to award the scholarship includes: Must serve in a Church Ministry and participate in a Ministry when not in school/college. (1) Academic achievement, shown by grade point average, etc., (2) Extent of Church involvement, (3) Extent of community involvement, (4) Leadership skills; (5) Work history; (6) Writing skills, demonstrated by the application essay, (7) Achievements in particular fields (sports, debate, performing arts, etc.), (8) A description of extra-curricular involvement. Additional requirements for the award are listed in the scholarship application. Please see the Church Website or request a copy of the application from the Board of Deacons Ministry Scholarship Committee. Answers to all questions must be typed or legibility printed in black ink on a separate sheet of paper.

Please review the application to ensure it has been completed correctly and that all supporting/required documentation is attached.

The scholarship application must be submitted for consideration each year to the Board of Deacons Ministry Scholarship Committee by December 21 (the deadline date). They are the scholarship administrators responsible for reviewing applications, selecting recipients, and making the scholarship awards.
