#### Verse 7

## An address to a particular congregation

the Angel...Philadelphia (philo = love + delphi = city)

- The youngest of the seven cities
- · Greek missionary city
- Greatest highways gateways to the world
- Often called "little Athens"

## An introduction of Jesus

holy (hagios = like God) and true (alethinos = not fake, real) Holds the keys of David

Reference to Isaiah 22:20-23 – Keys give authority and power he opens, no one can shut he shuts, no one can open

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Verse 8
A statement regarding the condition of the church
I know your deeds (ergon).
See (iudo = behold - aha!, look! - first behold of three)
      I have placed...an open door
 Open door - refers to evangelistic work (I Cor. 16:9; Col 4:3)
 Could be in contrast to closed synagogue.
      that no one can shut (Rev. 3:7 - He opens...)
I know (because) you have little strength
 strength = dynamis = supernatural power
The phrase is a compliment – they have ONLY supernatural
strength, meaning that they have learned to depend upon Chirst.
Like Paul – strength in weakness (2 Cor. 12:7-10)
A verdict from Jesus regarding the condition of the church
yet
      you have kept (tereo = guard) MY word
(Ps. 119:11 – I have hidden...; Prov. 7:2 – guard my teachings...)
      have not denied (not refused to speak) my name
Verse 9
A command from Jesus to the church
(behold #2!) I will make
             of the synagogue of Satan (working for Satan)
             who claim to be Jews
                   they are not
                   but are liars
I will make them
       come and
      fall down at your feet and (proskyneo = pay homage)
       acknowledge (ginosko = know) that I loved you
 ultimate justice = for them to know who God really loves!
Verse 10
A command from Jesus to the church
Since...you have kept my command
        to endure patiently (hypomone = remain under)
I will keep (toreo = guard) you from the hour of trial
       to come upon the whole world
       to test those who live on the earth
Is this a promise of rapture or protection during the tribulation?
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Verse 11
A command from Jesus to the church
(behold #3) I am coming soon (tachy = quickly, without delay).
Hold on (krateo) to what you have
so that no one will take your crown (stephanos)
The crown is given to the one who CONTINUES to the END
Verse 12
A promise of reward
Him who overcomes (nikao)
I will make him a pillar (stylos) in the temple (naos)
of my God
Philadelphia was the scene of many earthquakes – often the only thing left standing were pillars of great buildings.

Never again will he leave it.

Never affected by the shifting grounds around them

I will write on him

- 1) the name of my God
- 2) the name of the city of my God

The New Jerusalem

which is coming out of heaven from my God

3) my new name.

The custom of many cities is to carve names of people, places, and families that have been established as the "founders" or "heroes" on the pillars of the buildings.

Verse 13

A general exhortation to all Christians

He who has an ear

Let him hear what the Spirit says to the churches

#### Overview:

- Like Smyrna Philadelphia is encouraged
- Like Smyrna it faces the attack of the Synagogue of Satan
- Unlike Smyrna it does not face persecution unto death
- Philadelphia is challenged to hold on to what it has don't quit – don't give in!
- Though small and weak in the world, it must not neglect the open door of opportunity placed before it!

IV. The Church at Laodicea (3:14 - 22)



#### Verse 14

An address to a particular congregation the Angel...Laodicea ("rule of the people") write

- Important and wealthy
- 3 prides wealth, textiles, and eye-salve
- 3 problems poor water supply, vulnerable, compromise

### An introduction of Jesus

The words of the Amen (amen = so be it, it is done)

"amen" is directly transliterated from the Hebrew which means it is old – some say it is the best known word in history
The faithful (pistis) and true (alethenos) witness (martys)
The ruler (arche = beginning, master) of God's creation
Verse 15

A statement regarding the condition of the church I know your deeds,

neither cold (psychros) nor hot (zestros)

I wish you were either one or the other!

Cold = against, Hot = in favor, neither = indifferent
The one thing worse than being anti-Christ is to be <u>indifferent!</u>
Verse 16

A verdict from Jesus regarding the condition of the church So, because you are lukewarm

neither hot nor cold

I am about to spit (emeo = to vomit) you out of my mouth. Hot water heals. Cold water refreshes. Lukewarm is useless.

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Verse 17
You say (Out of the heart the mouth speaks - Luke 6:45)
            "I am rich:
            I have acquired wealth
            (I) do not need a thing."
But you do not realize (oida = to know) that
you are
            wretched (tailaiporos = heavy with trials)
            pitiful (eleeinos = in need of mercy)
            poor (ptochos = fallen into begging)
             blind (typhlos = pride and blind)
            naked (gymnos = bare, unclad, vulnerable)
Verse 18
A command from Jesus to the church
I counsel you (Jesus' prescription for their illnesses)
      to buy from me
            1) gold refined in the fire
                   so that you can become rich
             2) white clothes to wear
                   so you can cover your nakedness
             3) salve to put on your eyes
                   so you can see
Verse 19
      I rebuke (elegcho = to convict in order to correct)
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Those whom I love (phileo = brother love)

I rebuke (elegcho = to convict in order to correct)

and discipline (paideuo = God brings trials to train)

So

be earnest (zeloo = imperative - hot with zeal)

Rom.12:11 - never lack in zeal, keep your spiritual ferver!

and repent (imperative = turn toward God)

#### <u>Verse 20</u>

Here I am!

I stand (continuous) at the door and knock (continuous). This is addressed to Christians who have closed Christ out of their lives!

## If anyone (personal statement) hears my voice and opens the door I will come in and eat (supper - time of intimate talk) with him and he with me <u>verse 21</u> A promise of reward To him who overcomes (nikao) I will give the right to sit with me on my throne just as I sat down with my Father on his throne verse 22 A general exhortation to all Christians He who has an ear,

let him hear what the Spirit

says to the churches.

## **Quick Summary:**

John Stott once wrote, "The Laodicean church was a half-hearted church. It describes vividly the respectable, sentimental, nominal, skin-deep religiosity which is so wide spread among us today. Our Christianity is flabby and anemic, we appear to have taken a lukewarm bath."
