

I. The Introduction to Chapters 4 - 19

- The Holy Spirit directs John to move from the seven churches into "things which shall take place after this". (Rev. 1:19)
- (4:1) Meta tauta = after these things... transitional point
- Other prominent pictures of heaven:
 - Isaiah 6:1-8
 - Ezek. 1:1-28
- John uses symbols however, NOT everything is symbolic!
- Interpretational truth: The symbol is always less than reality!
- Chapters 4 19 deal with God's judgements preceding Christ's earthly reign – known as the "Messianic Woes" or the "Great Tribulation"
- 7 seals, 7 trumpets, 7 signs, and 7 bowls = God's wrath
- Chapter 4 provides the focus of WHERE the judgement comes from

II. John Enters Heaven (vs. 1 – 2a)

Verse 1

I looked (horao = look in order to perceive - 70 times in Rev!)
and there (behold = aha! You Look! You Look!)

Before me was a door (3:8 - an open door) standing open in heaven.

And the voice

I had first heard (30 times! - Rev. 1:10 - Jesus speaking) speaking to me like a trumpet (loud (84) call to action)

"Come (anabaino = command = spring up) up here"

"I will show you what must (deo = will) take place"

<u>Preterist</u> = Prior to John (AD95), <u>Historicists</u> = after John before now (AD95 - present), <u>Futurists</u> = after now. Seems to point to after John...has not happened yet...therefore future yet!

Interesting note:

The word "church" does not occur in chapters 4 - 19! This lends some simple support to a rapture prior to this on earth.

Verse 2

At once (eutheos = immediately, without delay)

I was in the spirit... (Rev. 1:10 - no article)

Where was John's body during this time?

His body if left on earth was in the midst of time while his spirit was in heaven outside of time – how much time passed during this experience? Was this a vision or was it physical?

Paul heard testimony of a man who went up to the third heaven (2 Cor. 12:1-4)

III. John Sets the Scene (vs. 2b - 8a)

Verse 2b

1) There before me (behold) was a throne (thronos= royalty) in heaven

The throne (14,43,58) is the centerpiece and theme of chapter 4 2) with someone sitting on it

Despite what people want to believe – God is ON His throne! Atheism = no throne, Humanism = man on the throne Verse 3

The one who sat there had the appearance (homoios = like)

- A) Jasper (precious stone probably clear or white)
- B) Carnelian (sardion = blood colored precious stone)

First and last stone on the priests breastplate - Ex. 28

3) A rainbow of emerald encircled the throne


A rainbow made of emerald stones - green mostly



White Jasper



Emerald



- There is no form in the description of the one who sits on the throne only colors and emanations of light.
- Some say the rainbow represents God's covenant to Noah and generations after him (Gen. 9:11-17)

<u>Verse 4</u>

4) Surrounding the throne were twenty-four other thrones.

Lesser thrones that the main one

- 5) Seated on them were twenty-four elders.
 - A) dressed in white
 - B) had crowns (stephanos) of gold on their heads

Angels or humans?

Why 24? - some say 24 courses of priests (I Chron. 24) or 12 tribes + 12 disciples? Elders generally represent the saints.

III. John Sets the Scene (vs. 2b - 8a)

Verse 5

- 7) From the throne
 - A) flashes of lightening
 - B) rumblings (phone = sounds of voices/singing)
 - C) pearls of thunder

Seems to be similar to Mount Saini (Ex. 19 and 20; Rev. 8:5,11:19)

8) Before the throne seven lamps were blazing.

These are the seven spirits of God.

Seven blazing lamps = seven angels (3:1, 5:6, 8:2) Verse 6

9) Before the throne there was what looked like a sea of glass, (could be water)



Verse 6b

clear as crystal (like clear quartz)

- 10) In the center, around the throne
 - A) four
 - B) living
 - C) creatures (appear to be cherubim)
 - i) Covered with eyes
 - a) in front and in back (like school teachers)

Verse 7

- ii) First was like a lion
- iii) Second was like an ox (moschos = young bull)
- iv) Third had a face like a man
- v) Fourth was like a flying eagle

Similar to Ezekiel chapter 1 and 10 and Isaiah 6:1 - 3 Verse 8

- vi) each had six wings
- vii) was covered with eves
 - a) all around
 - b) even under his wings

Theories about the four living creatures:

- The four divisions of the tribes of Israel:
 - Judah Lion
- Ephraim Ox
- Reuben Man
- Dan Eagle
- The division of creation Lion king of wild animals, Ox king of domesticated animals, Eagle king of birds, Man king over all animals.
- Some say it represents the four gospels
- Represents creation with animals, man, and wings of angels.

IV. What Happens in Heaven (vs. 8b - 11)

Verse 8b

Day and Night (no rest needed in heaven!)

They never stop saying,

"Holy, holy, holy" (3 X holy = hagios = set apart)

is the Lord God Almighty" (pan krator = holding)

who was, and is, and is to come" (eternal fact)

The purpose of all those in heaven = worship God!

Verse 9

Whenever the living creatures give

- A) glory (doxa = state of splender)
- B) honor, (time = reverence due to worth)
- C) thanks (eucharistia = the act of loving remembrance)

to him who sits on the throne and who lives for ever and ever

All the focus in upon God and praising Him

Verse 10

the twenty-four elders

- A) fall (pipto = to prostrate) down before him who sits on the throne
- B) and worship (proskyneo =pay homage) him who live for ever and ever
- C) They lay (ballo = cast/throw) their crowns before the throne and say

The elders are prompted to worship by the living creatures. The tradition of casting and taking up your crowns.

Verse 11

D) they say

i) you are worthy (axios = weighed correct)

ii) our Lord (kyrios) and God (theos)

iii) to receive

a) glory and

b) honor and

c) power (dynamis = our effort)

iv)For YOU

a) created all things

b) by your will they were created

c) have their being"
