

## I. Paul Speaks to the Rioters (21:37 - 40)

Verse 37

As the soldiers

were about to take Paul into the barracks.

he asked the commander,

"May I say something to you?"

"Do you speak Greek?" he [the commander] replied.

#### Verse 38

"<u>Aren't you</u> the 1) <u>Egyptian</u> who started 2) <u>a revolt</u> and 3) led four thousand <u>terrorists</u>

(sikarios = dagger men)

out into the wilderness some time ago?"

# The "Egyptian" and the Sicarii


Josephus – the most famous ancient historian in his writings mentions three rebel leaders who led Jewish uprisings against Roman occupation of Jerusalem: Judas the Galilean, Theudas and "The Egyptian".

The Sicarii (dagger men) would use a type of dagger called a jambiya to assassinate Roman leaders and Jewish sympathizers. They were feared because of their ability to kill and escape

without being caught. "The Egyptian" led an insurrection in 54 AD against Rome that led to thousands of deaths.



NOTE: Some have claimed that Judas was a Sicarii due to his name Judas Iscariot.



#### Verse 39

Paul answered,

- 1) "I am a Jew,
- 2) from Tarsus in Cilicia,a citizen of no <u>ordinary</u> city.Please let me speak to the people."

Tarsus ranked with Alexandria and Athens as a city of Greek culture and importance.

## Verse 40

After receiving the commander's permission,
Paul stood on the steps
and motioned to the crowd.
When they were all silent,
he said to them in Aramaic: [local language of Jews]

## II. Paul's Call to Ministry (22:1 - 21)

#### Verse

"Brothers and fathers, listen now to my defense." (apologia = apology = explanation and defense)

#### Verse 2

When they heard him speak to them in <u>Aramaic</u>, they became very quiet.
Then Paul said:

#### Verse 3

- 1) "I am <u>a Jew</u>, (Jewish parents)
- 2) born in Tarsus of Cilicia, (Greek culture)
- 3) but brought up in this city. (Jerusalem)
- 4) I studied under <u>Gamaliel</u> (Respected and was <u>thoroughly trained</u> Rabbi and in the law of our ancestors. Pharisee)
- 5) I was just as zealous for God as any of you are today.

## Verse 4

1

I <u>persecuted</u> the followers (Leader of the Sanhedrin) of this Way to their death, <u>arresting</u> both men and women and <u>throwing</u> them into prison,

#### Verse 5 Verse 11 as the high priest My companions led me by the hand and all the Council can themselves testify. into Damascus, I even obtained letters from them because the brilliance of the light to their associates in Damascus, had blinded me. and went there to bring these people Verse 12 as prisoners to Jerusalem "A man named Ananias came to see me. to be punished. He was a devout observer of the law Verse 6 and highly respected "About noon [new info -- Acts 9] by all the Jews living there. as I came near Damascus, Verse 13 suddenly a bright light from heaven He stood beside me and said. flashed around me. [brighter than the 'Brother Saul, noon day sun] receive your sight!' And at that very moment Verse 7 I was able to see him. I fell to the ground and heard a voice say to me, Verse 14 'Saul! Saul! "Then he said: Why do you persecute me?' 'The God of our ancestors Verse 8 1) has chosen you "'Who are you, Lord?' I asked. 2) to know his will "'I am Jesus of Nazareth, [new info] 3) and to see the Righteous One ["Messiah" Isa. 32] whom you are persecuting,' he replied. 4) and to hear words from his mouth. This is probably 20 years after the death of Christ, so people Verse 15 would probably just have heard the story. You will be his witness to all people Verse 9 of what you have seen My companions saw the light, and heard. but they did not understand the voice Verse 16 of him who was speaking to me. And now what are you waiting for? Verse 10 Get up, "'What shall I do, Lord?' I asked. be baptized "'Get up,' the Lord said, and wash your sins away, 'and go into Damascus. calling on his name.' [Rom. 10:13] There you will be told all that you have been assigned to do.' 2

#### Verse 17

"When I returned to Jerusalem [3 years after conversion] and was praying at the temple,
I fell into a trance

### Verse 18

and saw the Lord speaking to me.

'Quick!' he said.

'Leave Jerusalem immediately,
because the people here
will not accept your testimony about me.'

## Verse 19

"'Lord,' I replied,
'these people know that I went from
one synagogue to another
to imprison
and beat those who believe in you.

#### Verse 20

And when the blood of your martyr Stephen was shed,
I stood there giving my approval and guarding the clothes of those who were killing him.'

#### Verse 21

"Then the Lord said to me, 'Go;
I will send you far away to the Gentiles.' "

## Paul states:

- 1) You can't claim I am anti-Semitic I am a Jew just like you!
- 2) You can't claim that I am not a "good" Jew I have a reputation with the High Priest and the Sanhedrin as a member myself!
- 2) You can't claim I don't understand how you feel about those outside of your religion I felt the same way!
- 3) You can't claim that I left Judaism God called me to follow Christ!
- 4) You can't claim that I chose to preach to the Gentiles God sent me to preach to them!

## III. Paul's Citizenship Revealed (22:22 - 30)

#### Verse 22

The crowd listened to Paul until he said <u>this</u>. [the word "Gentiles"] Then they raised their voices and shouted,

"Rid the earth of him!

He's not fit to live!"

#### Verse 23

As they were shouting and throwing off their cloaks and flinging dust into the air,

Like when they stoned Stephen, the Jewish leaders took off their outer clothing.

#### Verse 24

the commander ordered
that Paul be taken into the barracks.
He directed that he be <u>flogged</u>
and interrogated
<u>in order to find out</u>
why the people were shouting at him like this.

### Verse 25

As they stretched him out to <u>flog</u> him,
Paul said to the centurion standing there,
"Is it legal for you to flog a Roman citizen
who hasn't even been found guilty?"

The Portion law and the Valerian Law forbid any Roman from ever going through punishment by flagellum.

## Verse 26

When the centurion heard this, he went to the commander and reported it.

"What are you going to do?" he asked. "This man is a Roman citizen."

## Verse 27

The commander went to Paul and asked, "Tell me, are you a Roman citizen?" "Yes, I am," he answered.

## Verse 28

Then the commander said,

"I had to <u>pay a lot</u> of money
for my citizenship." [usually bribes]

"But I was <u>born a citizen</u>," Paul replied.

[we don't know how his father gained his citizenship]

## Verse 29

Those who were about to interrogate him withdrew immediately.

The commander himself was alarmed when he realized that he had put Paul, a Roman citizen, in chains.

#### Verse 30

The commander wanted to find out exactly why Paul was being accused by the Jews.

So the next day
he released him
and ordered the chief priests
and all the members of the Sanhedrin
to assemble.
Then he brought Paul

Then he brought Paul and had him stand before them.

The next opportunities – a trial before the Sanhedrin – then Felix – then Festus – then Agrippa – then Rome! For the next few chapters we are going to be in court with Paul.
